In the House of Commons Thomas Sexton denounced the conduct of the Opposition in regard to the Evicted Tenants' Bill as rancorous and sullen. The House was menaced, he said, by the Lords' rejection of the bill, but such threats had no weight with the people of Ireland. Let the House of Lords do their worst, he declared, the rejection of the bill meant difficulty in governing Ireland, whose people were passing through another period of agony. But, Lords or no Lords, the principle of the bill would ultimately prevail. (Cheers.)
