**CANADA'S EXHIBIT.**—Canada is sending to the Paris Exhibition a section of Douglas fir fourteen ft. in diameter, besides which the mammoth section which has been for years on view on Parliament Hill, Ottawa, dwindles into insignificance. The tree from which this fourteen-foot section was cut was felled on Vancouver Island, between Victoria and Nanaimo, and as a branch railway track had to be built to the place, it cost \$1,500 to get the section out to the main line. It is the intention of Mr. Macoum, who has charge of the forestry exhibit, to have the big section put on exhibition in Ottawa.

**ANOTHER FATHER OUTWITTED.**—Young people take queer ways of eloping these days. The most unique and daring elopement on record recently took place near Blackwell, O. T., says the New Orleans Times-Democrat. Jennie Harris and William Jacobs were very much in love, but she had a father who was strongly opposed to the match. He threatened to shoot his daughter's lover if he showed himself on the place. One night they planned a coup. Miss Harris was put in an air tight barrel by a friendly servant and the barrel was thrown into the river, back of the house. It floated down the stream with its cargo of human freight until near a bridge, where the young man caught it and rescued the girl. They were married by a clergyman in waiting and left the country. Later the old man, when he heard of the daring escapade, sent word for them to come home and receive the paternal blessing.
