TRouble WITH THE CHINESE. LONDON, June 3.—A special from Shanghai says that the German officers who were left to drill the Chinese army have been subjected for some time to indignities and outrage in the hope of forcing them to resign. Recently two of the Germans were beaten by the soldiers, and now an officer named Kruss has been murdered by the body guard of Lin Kun Yeh, the vicar of Nankin. Consequently, it is added, the entire German squadron in Chinese waters has been ordered to Nankin. It is expected that Germany will withdraw fifty officers now in the Chinese army and insist upon the payment of the whole time of their contract. Another dispatch says that the Kausses rebels have defeated the Chinese general, Tung, with terrible slaughter and that the vicar of Nankin has ordered the despatch of the German drilled troops to assist in suppressing the rebellion.

NEWS NOTES.

On June 21 the twenty-first anniversary of Pope Leo's first communion will be celebrated in all the churches of Rome. A collection of relics belonging to the first family, descendants of Shakespeare's sister Joan, will be auctioned off in London this week. A consignment of plates from Canada has recently been received in London, and has attracted attention because of its excellent quality. The Marquis of Salisbury's present horse party will be a historical event, as it is one of the grandest entertainments since the days of Queen Elizabeth. The Princess of Wales, her daughters, and Prince Charles of Denmark were present. On Monday last Mr. Lav's was stepping on the Canadian Pacific Railway at Atholville, when the train caught his coat and his pocketbook, containing \$2,000 in ten dollar bills, dropped out. A strong wind scattered the notes in all directions. A party of searchers was organized and inside of an hour all the money except \$150 was recovered. A gun cartridge exploded in the central powder magazine of the French ironclad Admiral Duperre at Toulon recently blowing out the magazine door to a distance of thirty feet. The magazine was closely packed with three tons of explosive shells, but no further harm was done. The crew of the vessel stood to quarters while Admiral Duverre went in to find out what happened, all expecting to be blown up.
