Jim Parker Chills Europe's Champ In 3rd Round Sunday

DORTMUND, Germany (AP)—James J. Parker of Barrie, Ont., knocked out Germany's former European heavyweight champion, Heinz Neuhaus, in the third round of a scheduled 10-round fight here Sunday night. Both fighters weighed 218½ pounds. Neuhaus, 30, was as surprised as the 14,000 fans in Westfalenhalle when the 27-year-old Canadian floored him with a terrific left hook to the chin. In the first two rounds Parker seemed easy prey for the German who was banging away freely at the slow-moving Canadian. Neuhaus seemed to go out for an early knockout in the third round when he cornered Parker and plastered him with right and left hooks to head and body.

DRESS REHEARSAL

But the Canadian suddenly saw Neuhaus' exposed chin and his left hook caught the German unprepared. The impact was so great that the German was lifted up and then crumpled to the mat. He had not completely regained his senses when Dutch referee Barend Bergstroem counted him out. The fight was regarded by Neuhaus as a dress rehearsal for his European title fight against Italy's title holder Francesco Cavicchi in Bologna early in June. Parker is a leading contender for the Canadian heavyweight title and a claimant of the British Empire championship.

Dave Sime Shatters Drake Record At Meet On Saturday

DES MOINES (AP)—Muscular Dave Sime, Duke University sophomore, shattered a 30-year-old Drake relay record Saturday with a 9.4 win in the 100-yard dash over a waterlogged track. Rapidly gaining stature as a top United States Olympic candidate for the 100-metre, the 190-pound Sime handed Bobby Morrow of Abilene Christian College his first century defeat in 31 starts by 1½ yards. The 9.4 effort under miserable conditions, which forced the pole vault and high jump events in doors, cracked the 9.5 Drake record set by Nebraska State's late Roland Locke in 1926. Locke's mark was tied by two Olympic sprinters, Ralph Metcalfe of Marquette in 1932 and Ohio State's Jesse Owens in 1935. Sime's time, a tenth of a second behind the world century mark, was the only record-breaking performance in the two-day competition for athletes from 75 universities and colleges. LED ALL THE WAY Abilene Christian, with Morrow anchoring two races, took meet honors with three relay titles. The bad weather, while underlining Sime's great sprinting ability, eliminated expected record smashing outdoor performances by shotputter Parry O'Brien, high jumper Ernie Shelton and pole vaulter Bob Gutowski of Occidental.

Landy Arrived In U.S. Sunday

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) John Landy, Australia's world premier miler, flew into San Francisco Sunday morning. Alert and apparently somewhat more rested than when he left Sydney, the lean, curly-haired middle-distance champion worked out in Honolulu briefly Saturday. Landy, who holds the mile record at 3:58, is scheduled to run twice in the United States—May 5 at Los Angeles Coliseum and May 12 at Fresno. "I am running much better than when I broke the record at Turku, Finland, in 1954, but I doubt if I ever again will find such perfect conditions," he said. Landy, who trains himself and hasn't had a coach since before the 1952 Olympics, told a press conference that record smashing is dependent upon three main factors: Competition track conditions and weather.
