Montague Is In A Hurry For A Link With T-C Highway

Pavement linking Montague with the Trans-Canada Highway should not be delayed, it was emphasized by the Montague Town Council.

Mayor Bruce H. Yeo presided at the regular meeting held in the Council chambers Tuesday night with Councillors Green, Fraser, Clements and Vanderstine present.

Following the regular business, committee reports were presented: Councillor Green, reporting for the streets committee, said that work was to begin this week. Due to inquiries by many business firms as to costs, a discussion arose with reference to paving the clay strip between streets and sidewalks. As a result, the clerk G. Arnold Wightman was requested to obtain this information.

Mentioned in the report of Councillor Fraser, was the fact that the museum had already attracted a considerable number of people, and many were anxiously awaiting the opening date. Councillor Clements offered the information that many interesting and historic items had come in, some of really exceptional value.

Councillor Clements then brought up the water safety program which had been carried out last year. The council as a whole felt that parents of the children concerned would have to take a greater interest and a more active part in the program or it would fail. Also discussed from Councillor Clements' report were non-resident taxes and tax arrears, the deadline for payment to be July 1.

Mr. Gunning began his hotel career in 1929 when he joined the Mount Royal Hotel there. He joined the Canadian National Hotel system in 1938 as assistant manager of the Chateau Laurier in Ottawa. Mr. Gunning served with the army in the Second World War and on demobilization returned as assistant manager at Jasper Park Lodge, he was appointed manager in 1948. He became manager of the Nova Scotian Hotel in 1953.

Mr. Pitt is a native of England and after serving in the hotel field in that country came to Canada and joined the hotel department of the CNR in 1928. He filled various positions in the hotel chain before enlisting with the Canadian Army in 1941. On his return in 1946, he was appointed manager of the Bessborough at Saskatoon. Mr. Pitt has subsequently served as manager of the Prince Edward at Brandon, the Fort Garry at Winnipeg and the Charlottetown Hotel in Charlottetown.

Mr. Pellerin assumes the post of manager of The Charlottetown after serving in various capacities at the Nova Scotian Hotel. He was born and educated in Montreal and began his Canadian National service with the accounting department in that city — in 1920. He joined the hotel department in 1932 as front office cashier at the Nova Scotian, progressing to the position of assistant manager in 1941. He was appointed manager of Pictou Lodge in Nova Scotia in 1946 returning to the Nova Scotian in 1955 as assistant manager. He has served as relieving manager of the Newfoundland Hotel at St. John's and the Charlottetown Hotel at Charlottetown on numerous occasions.
