Scholarships and Bursaries

Scholarships and Bursaries are available for post graduate study. Each week there will be a list in the Cadre as well as advertisements over CIMN of scholarships and bursaries. More information is available on these as well as others at Student Services.

Samuel Bronfman Foundation

These scholarships are for students who are going on to get a masters degree in Business Administration. There are two types of scholarships.

Type A: Eight scholarships valued at \$1,000.00. Candidates must be in their first year of a graduate program. Closing date is March 15, 1975.

Type B: Scholarship is given to people in their final year of a graduate program

leading to a master's program. There are four scholarships valued at \$1,600.00

Professional Fellowships

Two fellowships available, valued at \$2,500.00. Candidates must have a degree from a Canadian University and be intending to a professional university. Law or medicine for example. This scholarship is restricted to Women only.

PEI Libraries Bursary

Valued at \$1,000.00 per year. There is one scholarship available. When finished there is no guarantee of a job but if there is one available on the Island candidate will be required to take it. Tenable at any university offering a libraries course.
