

Ch'town Driving Park Stages Opening Race

Charlottetown Driving Park opened the lid of its 1964 harness racing season Saturday night and some 800 fans helped celebrate at the action-filled opening.

Miss Kemble, an Abner T. Clegg mare owned by Everett Stott, and trained by Don MacNeill, was the lone double winner on the eight-dash card. Miss Kemble did it with ease in races one and five in the fine times of 2:11.3 and 2:12.4.

There were great battles in the remaining six events. The Sheik and W.M.X. had terrific skirmishes in races two and three, W.M.X. edging the Poulton trotter in the first mile but finishing in the runner-up spot to The Sheik in the second outing.

Janet M and Hurrah divided honors in the feature free-for-all. Walter Downe teamed Dr. P. and MacIntyre's Sancee. Harvester mare to a triumph in the opening trip of the feature.

However, Hurrah, a sound last in the initial jaunt, came on to grab the finale in convincing style. Janet's mile of 2:11.3 was the best of the night.

In the other class, Captain Chief made off with the opening mile but dropped to fourth the next outing which was won by Ellen Joyce.

Top ray of the night was the exactor of Captain Chief and Billy Champ, \$82.00. The second double of Ellen Joyce and Hurrah was a close second, posting \$82.00. The first daily double paid \$37.20 on the combination of Miss Kemble and W.M.X. and the other exactor, Miss Kemble and Countess Alice, was worth \$1.40.

Top win pay of the night was Janet M in the fourth, \$18.10.

Next race program at Charlottetown Driving Park goes this Thursday night, with starting time pushed back to 9:15. Races Saturday night will be held at the CDP on Saturday night.
