## THE MATHESON GOVERNMENT HAS PLEDGED ITSELF TO THE FOLLOWING EDUCATION PROGRAM...

- Larger School Units will be promoted by special grants of assistance and new legislation will be enacted to encourage their formation.
- Further substantial equalization grants will be made. This money will primarily be used to pay Teachers' Supplements in needy school districts and also to provide a more uniform level of School Services throughout the Province.
- Free Text Books to Grade VIII—This will mean a substantial saving to parents, especially those with large families.
- Further steps will be taken to encourage the removal of the higher grades from one and two room schools, and to accommodate those grades in central high schools.
- Additional courses will be provided at the Vocational School, and efforts will be made to take vocational short courses into rural areas. Commerce courses will be added in central high schools where practical.

- Larger grants to school districts to encourage permanent fire-proof construction where new schools are required.
- Greater efforts to cope with the problems of special education with particularly reference to slow learners and the mentally retarded.
- Efforts to further promote the effectiveness of the school supervisory service
- A thorough study will be made by the Government of the findings of the LaZerte Commission on school finance.
- Our school law will be modernized by a revision of the School Act.
- To urge the Federal Government to extend the payment of Family Allowance to children over 16 years of age who will continue their education in recognized institutions of learning.
