#### LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL.

SALINA, Kansas, June 24.—A terrible cyclone passed 15 miles northwest of this city last night. Three persons are dead and a number are dangerously injured.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 24.—According to advices received by the steamer Glenshiel, under date May 17, the war in the Philippine Islands is practically at an end, as only three outlying districts remain to be conquered by the Spanish troops. It is reported that the victors have been guilty of extreme cruelty and that prisoners and suspects have been tortured and slain unmercifully.

LONDON, June 24.—A representative deputation from Londonderry, headed by Mr. Vesey Knox, member of parliament for the city of Londonderry, accompanied by the Duke of Abercorn, Lord Lieutenant of Donegal, had an audience today with the Canadian premier, Sir Wilfrid Laurier, at the Hotel Cecil in order to urge the claims of Londonderry as a port of call for the new Canadian mail steamers. Subsequently, the same delegation had an audience with the Duke of Norfolk, the postmaster general, in order to ask the government to make arrangements for increased train facilities, so as to make the scheme complete. Both Mr. Laurier and the Duke of Norfolk promised to most carefully consider the suggestions made.
