

Reserves Decision In Q.A.H.A. Case

MONTREAL, (CP)—A Superior Court judge today reserved decision until Saturday on a request by the Quebec Frontenacs Hockey Club for an injunction to prevent its suspension by the Quebec Amateur Hockey Association.

The Q.A.H.A. has announced that Frontenacs would be suspended unless they released Marcotte. When Frontenacs made their request for an injunction against the Q.A.H.A., the Quebec Citadelles followed with a request for permission to enter the case. Mr. Justice A. I. Smith took the request under advisement until Saturday.

Carter Refuses Preliminary Weigh-in

MONTREAL, (CP)—Jimmy Carter, world lightweight champion who will defend his title here Nov. 11 against Montreal's Armand Savoie, refused Friday to go through with a preliminary weighing-in. Savoie weighed himself at 138.

Both fighters underwent a preliminary medical examination and were pronounced physically fit. Carter balked at the weigh-in, saying his contract calls for the official weighing at noon the day of the fight.

Meanwhile, promoter Raoul Godbout said indications now are that there will be a crowd of between 12,000 and 15,000 for the fight in Montreal Forum.

Seating capacity for fights at the Forum is 15,000, said Godbout, and with stands the capacity is around 17,500.

Carter is guaranteed \$25,000 for the fight; Savoie gets a 12 1-2 per cent cut of the gate. Estimated gate is \$70,000. The fight time is 10 p.m. EST, and there will be neither television nor radio broadcast.

WINNIPEG, (CP)—Winnipeg's oldtime football stars already are preparing for their exhibition game here Nov. 14 against former Calgary Stampeder by setting up practice sessions starting this week-end.

The big game, now dubbed "The Liniment Bowl", came about when Winnipeg challenged Calgary after the ex-Stamps defeated the junior Bronks 14-6 last Sunday. It will be played at the new Winnipeg Stadium at 1:30 p.m., with the proceeds going to the community chest campaigns in the two cities.

The former Blue Bombers will work out Saturday and Sunday afternoons and every evening next week except Wednesday.

Already in the fold are the brain-trusts, coach Reg Threlfall. Former imports also arriving soon include Martin Gainer, Wayne Shely, Bob Sandberg and Russ Rebholz.

Letourneau said a special clause has been inserted in the contract providing that if Harper wins the title he will have to defend it "within 60 days against any logical contender named by the federation."

a 76-mile ride by a local garage-man before its plight was discovered. Apparently unharmed it flew away when released by the motorist.

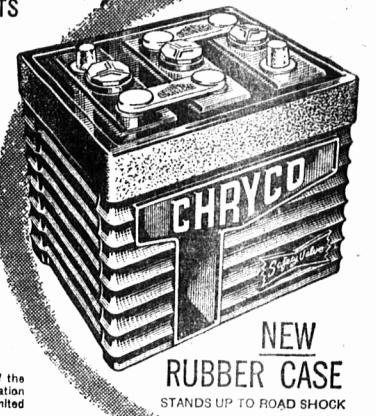
