June to End Social Credit Troubles

By George Friday, Canadian Press Staff Writer (C. P. By Guardian's Special Wire) CALGARY, May 13—Plans for Alberta's new deal to free its citizens from the millstones of debt, lessen taxation and create employment are moving forward according to William Aberhart, school-teacher-premier.

Head of the world's only Social Credit government, Premier Aberhart, who wants to return to his home province, said he has changed the

province on the road to full recovery, retains confidence of ultimate success despite setbacks from lack of finances.

"Development of Social Credit from theory to actual working operation must be a process of deliberate planning in stages," he declared today. "We must be given time."

Next major step toward the goal of Social Credit will be Premier Aberhart's \$100,000,000 refunding plan for the province's bonded debt. Thousands of bondholders in Alberta and throughout the Dominion await details of the refunding scheme.

They will not have to wait long,

said Mr. Aberhart.

"It's going to be done this month, and in a wise and proper way." Under the scheme bondholders will have to take less interest. Details of the plan will be announced shortly and in June the scheme, which will be compulsory, will be in operation.

The 58-year-old premier who left a Calgary school to take the premiership last August when his Social Credit League made an almost clean sweep in the provincial election, wants to be free from "outside attack."

He is determined to cease borrowing to wipe out debts his government inherited when the ad-

ministration of Alberta was taken over nine months ago. He refuses to surrender provincial autonomy.

He asks that the "outside world leave us alone." He has plans to ease the debt and interest charge burdens of the province and wants to make the way "safe while introducing our own system."
