YOUTH CHARGED WITH PIRACY

WEST PALM BEACH, Fla., May 23.—Federal authorities have entered a charge of piracy against Sanford Mobley, 18 year old youth held in jail here in connection with the robbery of the Bank of Stuart at that town, near here, last week, who, they allege to be a leader of pirate bands responsible for numerous raids recently on the cargoes of vessels in the vicinity of the State.

Bahama Islands. Requests by the Federal authorities yesterday that Mobley be placed in their custody were made, they said, as the result of an extensive investigation by both United States and British authorities of recent raids on ships which were said to have been conducted in true pirate style, and in one instance to have netted the alleged pirates \$15,000. Mobley is being held here with another youth with whom he was arrested after a chase leading half way across the State.
