## Renovation Reveals Beauty Of Old Archwa

OTTAWA (CP)—The renovation and refurbishing of the parliamentary Library, gutted by fire in August, 1953, has revealed the beauty of the 90-year-old entrance to the structure.

Workers, who expect to have the library ready for occupancy in the spring of 1956, have removed dust and grime of years from the archway to reveal one of the finest examples of gothic archwork in Canada.

The library was the only part of the original Centre Block saved from destruction in the 1916 fire. The newly-revealed entrance of granite and cylindrical ironwork is one of the few parts of the original building which were saved.

When the Prince of Wales, later King Edward VII, laid a cornerstone in 1860.

Framed in the stonework is the old arched wooden doorway of the library. Carvings made 80 to 90 years ago depict typical Canadian wildlife on the lower part of the door.

THE GOLDEN DOG

On the gothic-arched top panel of the doorway carvers' tools have retained for posterity the old French legend of the Golden Dog.

The carving shows a dog chewing a bone with another wolf-like animal looking on. The figures are in a scene of a dog and a wolf.

The floor of the renovated library is being raised to the same level as the main floor in the Centre Block. The floors were found to be out of kilter when the two buildings were joined after completion of the present Centre Block in 1919.

To remedy the situation the works department put in a ramp but it was replaced by a ramp after Sir Robert Borden, prime minister, failed to get the step and slippage and galls. His infirmity was painful and he was confined to his home for several days.

## Wage Increase Sought By Locomotive Firemen

MONTREAL (CP) - Canadian locomotive firemen will seek a 25 per cent wage increase, W. E. Galt, vice-president of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen and Engineers, announced Wednesday.

The brotherhood will also ask for time-and-a-half wage rates for work on statutory holidays and payment for statutory holidays which they do not work.

These demands, formulated by brotherhood chairman from Canada's major railroad companies at a meeting here Wednesday, will be presented to the railway companies by Feb. 1. Current contracts expire March 31.

The demands are roughly equivalent to those sought by the union in 1955.

## Some STILL SECRET

Some information still is secret because it relates both to peace-time and wartime uses of atomic energy. It remains classified under a Canada-U.K.-U.S. agreement on what information should be made public.

Dr. Baines said that some secret information may be of value in research on atomic power for peaceful purposes. Where this is the case security clearance has to be obtained for personnel handling such information.

However, he said "the things which are secret are not preventing private industry from building atomic power stations, Canadian General Electric, for example, is busy with the detailed design of Canada's first atomic power station and that company has access to all the information it needs."

Nils Chalk River atomic expert has left the plant to join private Canadian companies engaged in atomic projects. They include Dr. N. MacKay, former chief design engineer, now with Canadian General Electric, and Dr. Arthur Johnson, a top physicist, has joined Canadair Ltd. in Montreal. Canadair is designing a low-power Chalk River project.
