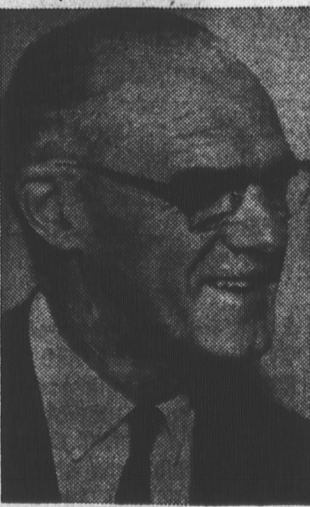

General Motors Earnings Given

DETROIT (AP)—General Motors Corp. reported Tuesday net earnings of \$1,200,000,000 of \$4.31 a share for the first nine months of 1966. The figures trailed 1965's record. The biggest of the U.S. automakers became the first to report its third-quarter and nine-month statement. GM said its net income in the comparable nine months last year was \$1,500,000,000 equal to \$5.36 a share. For the nine months this time, dollar sales totalled \$14,500,000,000 compared with \$15,000,000,000 in the equivalent 1965 period.
