

## Premier Shaw, Su Discuss CP Plant Strike

An unusual meeting between a defeated Premier and his successor-elect was brought about here yesterday by the damaging strike at the meat packing plant of Canada Packers Limited. Seeking a solution to ease the damage to farmers caused by overweight in hogs when they are held too long before marketing, Premier Walter Shaw and Premier-elect Alex Campbell met in Charlottetown to discuss the problems.

There is an urgency in the respect that every day the strike is prolonged, hogs rapidly become overweight and the price for these animals will depreciate as long as they are held," said Mr. Campbell.

Mr. Campbell mentioned the possibility of shipping the hogs at night under cooler weather conditions and said the CNR is putting the SS Scotia into operation Friday to help ease the heavy traffic situation brought about by a tremendous influx of tourists this year.

## Financial Critics Conformable

The measures, announced Wednesday by Prime Minister Harold Wilson, call for an immediate freeze in wages, salaries and prices and all-around increases in taxes in an effort to save the pound sterling.
