LETTERS TO THE EDITOR.

The Concert

Sir, - Judging from the rounds of applause that followed almost every number of the programme during the concert of last night in the Association Hall, I think it is perfectly safe to say that the performance was thoroughly enjoyed by the large audience in attendance. When an art is being gradually developed in any country it always has its growth in two directions, - one through the individual who must, by careful training of whatever artistic power is in his nature, develop the creative faculty; the other through the general medium of the collective public who, by having placed before it the highest models of whatever art is acknowledged to be excellent in art, develops that valuable quality which George Elliot calls "appreciative ability," without which the inhabitants of any city are not very far elevated above the monkeys of the forest.

But a few days ago a companion was wallowing to me in a most pessimistic manner about the blank horribleness of life in such a city as Charlottetown to any one who had developed in his nature a love of art in any of its varied forms, and compared the life of such an one to that of an angel dwelling in the infernal regions, whose fate it was to suffer from the slander of its inhabitants. His most pessimistic moan, however, lay in the direction of music, and he maintained that for years the art had been steadily deteriorating, and that the concerts given in Charlottetown six or seven years ago were much superior to those usually heard at present. But, judging from the excellence of the rendering of most of the music last night, from the evidence of careful cultivation and beauty of tone in some of the voices, from the refinement and expression with which the instrumentalists performed, and from the hearty appreciation of the audience, I think it is safe to say that Charlottetown is progressing favorably in the matter of musical art.

A Philharmonic Association or musical club is very much needed in the city at present, and as Mr. Earle is about preparing for an Oratorio Concert it is to be hoped that one will soon be started. The good work of teaching singing in the primary schools in Charlottetown is now being carefully done, I believe; and many a beautiful voice is sure to be developed by this means, and the possessor saved from degenerating into the unsatisfactory condition of being a "corvine croaker," a term that the ornithologists apply to his worship the crow, of whom Dr. Coues very quaintly remarks that "he has a syrinx in good order, though he has never learned to play on it."
