### Local and Other Items.

**NEWFOUNDLAND MINERALS**.—It will be a surprise to many to learn that in the last eleven years, Newfoundland has exported minerals to the value of \$7,529,158. The first copper mine opened—that of Tilt Cove—in 1864, is worked still, and gives employment to 590 miners, the last year gave the shareholders a clear profit of £33,000.
