

Oil Search Will Continue Off Canada's East Coast

HALIFAX (CP)—R. S. Sloan, senior engineer with Pan American Petroleum Corp., said here the company plans to continue its three-year search for oil with Imperial Oil Enterprises off Canada's East Coast.

Addressing students at Nova Scotia Technical College, Mr. Sloan said the companies "are quite hopeful that we can discover commercial quantities of hydrocarbons on the Grand Banks."

Two wells—one 4,834 feet deep and the other 3,250 feet—were drilled, plugged and abandoned this summer in an area about 300 miles south of St. John's, Nfld.

Zambian Aid To Provide Tanks

OTTAWA (CP)—Canada's pledge of a further \$500,000 in aid to Zambia will be spent to provide between 15 and 20 strategically located fuel storage tanks, the external affairs department has announced.

Extra assistance was promised in August by External Affairs Minister Martin.
