

Traffic Cases Swamp Alberton Court Session

ALBERTON — Three youths from Sea Cow Pond, Robert Emmet McCarthy, Donald Joseph Brennan, and Ralph Paul McCarthy pleaded guilty before Magistrate W. Chester S. MacDonald at Alberton yesterday of willfully damaging a straw stack on Hallowe'en night to an amount not exceeding \$50, the property of John Ready.

The cases were adjourned for one week in order for the accused to pay damages to Mr. Ready of \$48.

Two Alberton residents, Elizabeth Louise Greer and Greta Sandra MacDonald, represented by Bernard McCabe, were fined \$25 and costs for failing to stop before reaching a school bus which was discharging or picking up passengers.

Herman Kennedy, Waterford, was fined \$10 and costs for permitting an unlicensed person to operate a motor vehicle.

Emile Joseph Bernard, Pleasant View, was given a warning for driving without a license. For exceeding the speed limit in a 30-mile one Frederick Blaid Foley, O'Leary was fined \$10 and costs.

Alvin Arsenault, Waterford, was fined \$10 and costs for operating an improperly equipped vehicle and an additional \$10 for driving an unregistered vehicle.

For backing out on the highway where such movement could not be made with safety Mrs. Cecil Clements Cape Wolfe, was fined \$10 and costs.

Phillip Teddy Gallant, Coleman, was fined \$10 and costs for driving without a valid license and Donald Blair Ellis, O'Leary, was fined \$10 and costs for failing to stop at an intersection.

IMPROPERLY EQUIPPED
Gerald Ralph King, Glenwood, was fined \$10 and costs for permitting an improperly equipped vehicle to be operated on the highway and an additional \$10 for permitting an unlicensed person to drive. Mrs. King was given a warning for driving without a license.

Wilbur Justin Hogan Tignish was fined \$10 and costs for operating an improperly equipped vehicle.

Layton Burton Shaw, Springfield, was fined \$10 and costs for exceeding the speed limit in a 30-mile one.

Stephen Edward Butler, Mimgash pleaded guilty of willfully damaging a wire fence on Hallowe'en night to an amount not exceeding \$50 and the case was adjourned for one week.

Joseph Francis Arsenault, Tignish Shore, was fined \$75 and

costs for driving while impaired.

Felix Collicutt, Springfield West, was fined \$10 and costs for failing to stop at an intersection.

For making unnecessary and unreasonable noise while driving a motor vehicle, Harold Gray, O'Leary, was fined \$10 and costs.

Edmund DesRoches, Leville, received a fine of \$10 and costs for tire squealing.

Joseph Richard Handrahan, Tignish, was fined \$10 and costs for driving without due care and attention.

A charge of having care and control of a motor vehicle against Vernon McCarthy, represented by Bernard McCabe, was dismissed. The vehicle in question could not be started at the time.

A charge under the fishery regulations against Ivan Chester Adams of Montrose, represented by Melville Campbell, of failing to bring his vessel to the signal from a government vessel and throwing over part of the vessel's cargo, was dismissed. The Crown was represented by Neil MacLeod.

Two men from Tignish, one from Coleman, Harper Road, South Kildare, Alberton South, Oromocto, N.B. and Alberton received fines of \$20 and costs for possession of intoxicating liquor.

Three persons from the Tignish area, and one from Alberton were fined \$20 and costs for being intoxicated.

Magistrate Suspend Sentence
A two-year suspended sentence was imposed upon Thomas J. Larier, Charlottetown, when he appeared yesterday before Magistrate A. James Haslam, QC, on a charge of theft over \$50.

A \$500 bond was posted on behalf of the accused. Everett Condon Jr., Murray Harbor, was arraigned on a charge of having care and control of a motor vehicle while intoxicated and offered a plea of not guilty. Condon was remanded until Nov. 12 with bail set at \$130.

Raymond MacDonald, city, was assessed \$25 and costs or 30 days on a charge of theft under \$50.

A fine of \$20 and costs or 10

days was imposed on David A. Ling, Milton, on a speeding charge. Charles A. Dalton, Sherwood, was assessed \$15 and costs or five days on a similar charge. John L. Fraser, Montague, charged with drunken driving, pleaded not guilty and was remanded until Nov. 17 with bail to stand. Lester P. O'Donnell is representing the accused.

Ralph Weeks, city, charged with vagrancy was sentenced to 90 days in Queens County jail. The accused requested the sentence.

Similar fines of \$20 and costs or 30 days were imposed upon two men charged with illegal possession of liquor.

Assault Case Brings Fine

SUMMERSIDE — A Summerside man, Russell Ramsay, was fined \$10 and costs or 10 days when he pleaded guilty to assault before Magistrate R. S. Rinton, QC, in Town Police Court yesterday.

Wayne Crossman, Summerside, charged with arson, was remanded to Saturday in the custody of his parents without plea, to enable accused to get legal counsel.

Three men accused of loitering were remanded to Monday without plea.

A Charlottetown man did not appear in court on a charge of drunkenness and his bail was forfeited. A Summerside man charged with drunkenness was fined \$30 plus costs or 10 days.

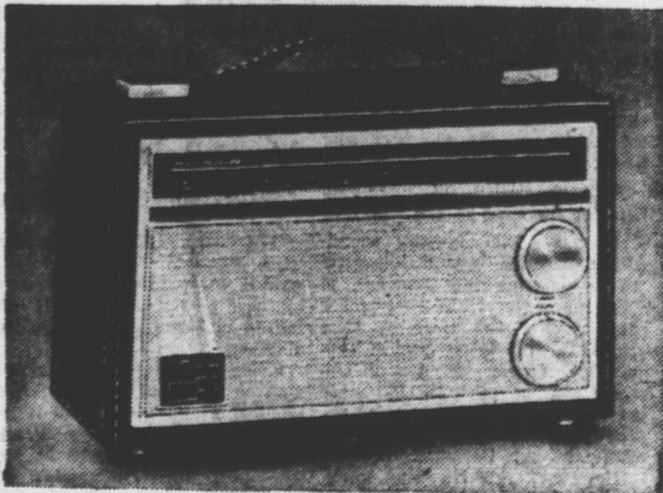

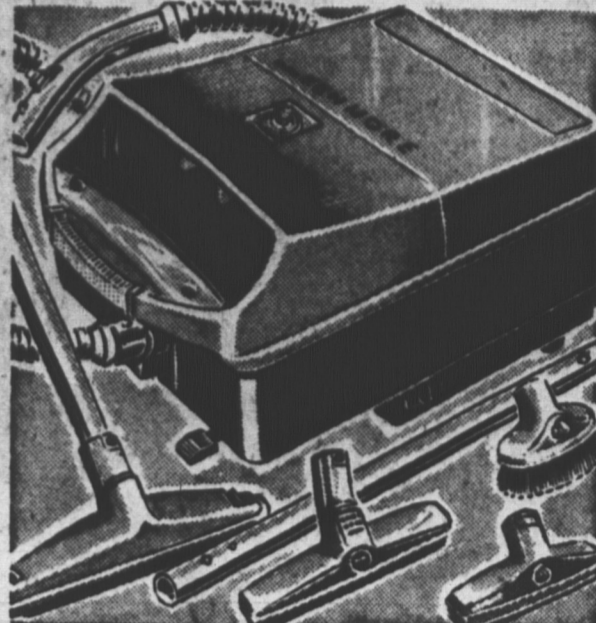
