**MRS. ARTEMAS SCHURMAN**

The many friends of Mrs. Artemas Schurman, Bedeque, P.E.I., were grieved to learn of her death on Friday morning, December 17th, 1957. She had been in failing health for some time, but was confined to her bed for only about a month previous to her passing.

Mrs. Schurman was the former Carrie Arabella Mattar, the daughter of the late Charles and Eliza P. Hood, Mattar, and was born in Wood, New Brunswick, on January 28, 1871. While in her teens, the family moved to Lower Bedeque.

She was united in marriage to Leander Toombs, Mayfield, who predeceased her in 1907, also an infant son, at the same time. A step-daughter Elva, Mrs. Harry Caldwell, passed away some twenty years ago.

In 1915, she was married to Artemas Schurman, Central Bedeque. After living on the farm there for three years, they retired from farm life and took up residence in the village of Centreville Bedeque.
