First Junior Seed Grain Club Organized

The first Junior Seed Grain Club to be organized on Prince Edward Island was formed at a meeting in the Farmington school on Thursday evening, June 15th. Members in this club are from Farmington, Mt. Hope and Five Houses districts.

The officers for the new club are: President, Elmer Curran; vice-president, Hubert MacLeod; secretary-treasurer, Elmer MacLeod; directors, Cyril Wood and Everett MacLeod. Other members are: James Mullally, Lester Wood, Russell Dockendorf, Whitney Judson, Tommy Larkin, Edmund Larkin, Alban Wood, Vernon Wood, Melvin Wood and Desmond Larkin.

Mr. S. C. Wright, Department of Agriculture, was present at the meeting and assisted the club in getting organized. It is planned to meet the first and third Thursdays of each month during the summer months. One meeting will be a study of grain crops in theory and the other will be a practical judging class or demonstration on standing or threshed grain with emphasis on weed identification.

In junior seed grain clubs it is required that each member grow an acre of seed grain the first year and at least two acres the second year. The members of this club planted their acre of grain before the club was officially organized.

Rustico Poultry Club

After the meeting poultry films were shown. During the day the club members were scored on their care and feeding of their poultry by C. S. Mrs. E. S. Rose, East Baltic, was elected as Adult Director. Mrs. Rose has been an adult director of club work in the past and has a wealth of poultry knowledge to impart. Mr. Nelson Stewart is the other adult leader, appointed at a previous meeting.

Three new members joined, bringing total membership to 18. Four interested adults were also present. After the business part of the meeting concluded their first poultry judging class was conducted. Mr. C. S. Scanton and H. MacLean, Dept. of Agriculture, were present at the meeting.

Sees Strikes As Threat To Freedom Of Press

OTTAWA, June 17 - (CP) - Canadian and United States publishers accused some labor unions of working against freedom of the press.

F. I. Ker, publisher of the Hamilton Spectator, and Frank E. Gannett, of the Gannett group of newspapers in the United States, were addressing the seventh Imperial Press Conference. Both referred to the current strike that paralyzed the New York World-Telegram and Sun.

Mr. Ker noted that delegates had been talking about government restrictions on press freedom. On this point, he said, the limitations imposed on the press by governments were less real than those caused by strikes called in defiance of our laws.

A strike which blacked out a newspaper, he said, was "the very antithesis of freedom of the press." The first thing aspirants to totalitarian government would do would be to black out the press. All the machinery for that process existed now.

"Much of the evil of these times," Mr. Ker added, "proceeds from labor departments of government." They were "nothing but a rendezvous for vote-seeking politicians and favor-seeking pressure groups."

An illegal strike might be called but, while machinery existed to give redress to injured publishers, it was not exercised. Mr. Ker said the rank and file of newspaper employees had as great a responsibility as the publishers. When they strung a picket line around a newspaper, they were deserting their posts. That applied, as well, to those who yielded to a picket line.

Both Mr. Ker and Mr. Gannett referred to coming technological advances in publishing, such as the new photo process being developed for printing. In the next five or 10 years, Mr. Ker said, it was hoped that "it will be possible for publishers with a handful of conscientious employees to get out a newspaper, regardless of any strike." The new process would be one of the greatest assets to freedom of the press.

Mr. Gannett, referring to the New York strike, said radical union leaders had made it impossible to distribute one of the country's largest papers. It was just as bad to have such leaders controlling the press as it was for the government to do that.
