Keith MacKenzie can give district loud, clear voice

There have been long periods in the electoral history of First Kings when the District was not represented in cabinet in the government of this province.

There have been exceptions, however, and it is significant to note that every Cabinet Minister from First Kings to serve in the administration of Prince Edward Island was appointed by a Conservative Government. He is married to the former Ann Rose, and they have three children: Linda, four; Eleanor, three; and Laura Lee, an infant daughter.
