

KENNEDY'S SUPPORTERS HEARTENED

Nixon Defeated May Quit Political Field

WASHINGTON (CP) — The Richard M. Nixon comeback drive crumbled Wednesday and the controversial Republican faced political oblivion as a pile-up of election returns nailed down the Democratic bid over Congress and loss of his states to Republicans.

By nature of his smooth retreat and the fact he runs the biggest state, New York Governor Nelson A. Rockefeller now looks like a sure bet for the unopposed victory of the Republicans with a top chance to grab the 1964 presidential nomination.

DR. STANBURY Commissioner Of Red Cross Dies Suddenly

SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico (AP) — William Stuart Stanbury of Toronto, national commissioner of the Canadian Red Cross Society, died Tuesday night apparently of a heart attack suffered in a hotel swimming pool.

Stanbury, 57, was in San Juan for a hemiplegic Red Cross meeting.

He became ill at the pool at the Caribe Hilton Hotel. Richard Glus, Canadian Red Cross public relations officer who was near him, tried mouth-to-mouth respiration, while an ambulance was summoned.

Oxygen was administered on his return to the San Juan Hospital, but without success.

Stanbury was born in Exeter, Ontario, June 29, 1905. He became national commissioner of the Canadian Red Cross in 1949.

Mrs. F. D. Roosevelt Dies In N. J. Hospital

NEW YORK (AP) — Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt, widow of the 32nd president of the United States, died Wednesday night.

The 78-year-old widow often was described as one of the best-known women in the world. She had been active in various governmental and semi-governmental agencies for many years, until she entered Columbia Presbyterian Medical Centre Sept. 26.

In the hospital, Mrs. Roosevelt was treated for anemia and a lung congestion. Her condition failed to improve but she was discharged Oct. 18 and returned to her home here for further treatment.

She was too ill to take part in Tuesday's New York state elections, although she had been instrumental in shaping the Democratic ticket. Her condition was such that the results were not conveyed to her.

A family spokesman announced: "Her doctors were with her because of indications of cardiac failure."

Mrs. Roosevelt's body will be taken to her home in Hyde Park. No one except the family will be allowed in her home. Funeral arrangements will be announced as soon as possible.

JFK Expresses Deep Sorrow

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Kennedy expressed sorrow Wednesday night at the death of Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt. He praised her as one of the great ladies of American history and said she was an inspiration to him as president.

The White House announced that Kennedy would attend the funeral of the widow of the late president Franklin D. Roosevelt.

Kennedy was informed of Mrs. Roosevelt's death by one of her sons, Representative James Roosevelt (Dem. Calif.) about 10 minutes before the public announcement. Roosevelt was understood to have called from California.

Four Winter Projects Approved For Prince

OTTAWA — Four more winter projects for Prince Edward Island have been approved by the federal government. The H. Phillips, MP for Prince, said here Wednesday.
