

Hazelgrove Man Injured Yesterday In Car Accident

Mr. Wendell Craswell, 31, of Hazelgrove was taken to the Prince Edward Hospital yesterday morning in an unconscious condition caused when the 1948 Dodge sedan he was driving was in collision with a 1938 Chevrolet coupe driven by Mr. Vernon Bryenton of North Wiltshire.

The victim regained consciousness about noon. His injuries though serious, are not critical. They are to the head and include multiple fractures in the chest area. At a late hour last night his physician reports his condition as much improved.

Police report that the accident occurred at the junction of the Dufferin and Johnston Road in the vicinity of Hartsville.

The ballots were mailed to the growers on the 24th and they were required to return them not later than May 29.

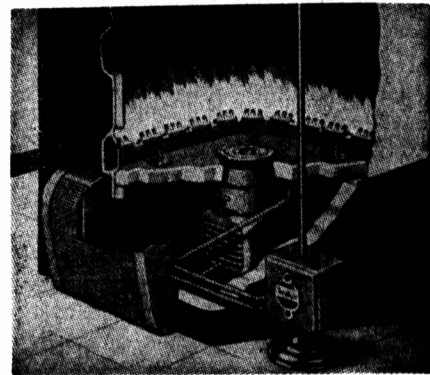
The evening was brightened by several musical selections, both vocal and piano, by pupils of the various grades.

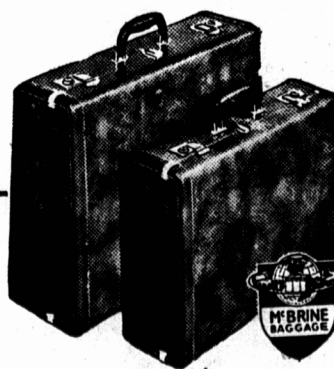
