Female Bonusing Policy To Be Expanded This Year By Holstein Association

The scheme of bonusing purebred female cattle which proved very successful last year will be expanded during the coming year, it was decided yesterday afternoon at the annual meeting of the Prince Edward Island branch of the Holstein Frelan Association which was held at the Exhibition Grounds with Mr. Ira C. Lewis, York presiding.

Under the bonusing plan \$25 is paid for the first female animal purchased by any individual or club. Last year 29 men or clubs made their first purchases and the meeting yesterday was well pleased with the results. In order to qualify for a bonus the animal must have R. O. P. standing or have graded good plus.

The branch decided to drop their bull bonusing policy in the light of the policy put into effect by the Provincial Government. The meeting praised the Government's bull bonusing policy.

This marks a change in the bonusing scheme of the Association. Up to last year most of the bonusing money was spent on bulls. Last year the money was evenly divided between males and females and this year it is being entirely given to females.

The Government's bull bonusing policy was explained to the members by Agriculture Minister G. C. Baker. He stated that he had received quite a few applications for the bonus but in many cases the applicants did not live in a community in which there were 50 female cattle, the minimum number required before a bonus can be granted.

Premier J. Walter Jones was present and told the meeting that in his opinion dairy breeds should be bonused three times as much as beef breeds for the good of the Province.

The possibility of an artificial insemination policy being started next year was mentioned by Premier Jones. He stated that such a plan could be started in a year's time as the Province now has the qualified veterinarians to go ahead with such a plan. One of the benefits would be that bulls from an accredited herd could serve animals who were not accredited.

Professor George Rathby of the Ontario Agricultural College at Guelph was named as judge of the Holsteins at the Provincial Exhibition this year. Professor Rathby judged the Holsteins and Jerseys here last year.

Mr. Dunro Ennis of Ontario was recommended as judge for the Maritime Winter Fair at Amherst this fall.

Mr. Ira Lewis of York was re-elected president of the Association at a meeting of the directors. Mr. Allison Proffitt Preetown was elected vice president and Mr. Cecil Stewart, secretary.

The members held a noon luncheon meeting at the Rendezvous where Premier Jones presented life time production certificates to Mr. Walter Buntain and Son, Rustico and Mr. Granville Buntain of Rustico. Hon. C. C. Baker, Minister of Agriculture and Mr. W. R. Shaw, Deputy Minister spoke briefly.

The Exhibition grant to the Charlottetown Exhibition Association will be the same as last year — \$6 for Holsteins shown over two years of age and \$4 for junior animals. No exhibitor can collect on more than one animal to a class.

\$40 was granted to both the Alberton and Souris exhibitions instead of the \$25 granted last year. The Association will support the calf clubs by paying \$5 for first prizes, \$4 for second, down to \$1 for fifth place.

Campaign Issues Reviewed By Geo. C. Nowlan, M. P.

Recalling the old saw about the wheel that gets the grease, Mr. George C. Nowlan, K.C., M.P., last night told a large audience at Bradshaw a constituency that squeaks far quicker than one which does not.

He was speaking at a Progressive Conservative meeting in support of Wing Cmdr. J. Angus MacLean who will represent his party in Monday's Federal by-election in Queen's County. Also present on the platform were Mr. R. R. Bell, K.C., M.L.A., provincial leader of the party and Mr. Frank Myers, M.L.A., who acted as chairman.

Mr. Nowlan said the Government did not need this seat, but that they wanted to win the next Federal election. If the constituency of Queen's County is likely enough on Monday Ottawa will know that the people here are not satisfied and try to do something about it. He told his hearers, "Don't believe you have to vote for the Government to get something. That is nonsense."

The speaker said "Parliament does not make a democracy," and cited the examples of Hitler Germany, Mussolini's Italy and the present Russia. In all there were parliaments but no democracy. "But," he said, "if within a parliament you have an opposition, recognized and functioning properly, then you have a real democracy."

He was critical of the advisability of having a parliament which is top heavy with Government members, and stated that a strong Opposition makes for better government at all times as it keeps the Government continually on the watch. With such a large Liberal representation in Ottawa at present the speaker said that rank and file members had little chance to place the needs of their constituencies before the House. Sending another there would benefit neither the Liberal Party nor Queen's County.

Mr. Nowlan said that the 20-man Cabinet decides policy and the rest of the party members have little to say and no opportunity for consultation. However, he felt the only real fight must come from a strong Opposition.

Need Another Fighter — He paid high tribute to the ability of Mr. W. Chester S. McLure, present Progressive Conservative member for Queen's, and told how all the country knew he was fighting for Island rights. He asked the voters to send Mr. McLure some help.

Referring to recent advertisements appearing in the Guardian he quoted a one-line ad of yesterday inserted by the Liberal Party which read "Remember the Conservative Depression." Mr. Nowlan said "Apparently they are trying to raise that old bogeyman again," and he went on to state that if the Liberals were so afraid of Mr. MacLean as to believe he is powerful

that came from all parts of Canada to give advantages to a particular area.

"We might get into trouble," he added.

Mr. Howe appeared before the committee chiefly to reply to complaints that the Maritimes and the West are not getting their share of defence production orders. He argued they are getting a fair proportion in relation to their production capacity.

Chief complainant has been Saskatchewan, and Mr. Howe said today scarcity of orders for that Province "is being rapidly corrected."

"As far as I know, every Saskatchewan firm capable of doing a job on any scale is busy," he said.
