Business Views To Be Sought On Coming Tariff Conference

The task of preparing for the coming conference of tariff talks at Geneva, Switzerland, in a few months, will speed up shortly when a group of government officials will be sounding out Canadian businessmen for their views.

The group, expected to be named within a few days, will be asking the businessmen to say how they might be hurt if Canada lowers tariffs on certain goods, and how they could profit if other countries can be talked into dropping barriers on Canadian products.

Once the information is collected from as many businessmen as possible, the negotiators will be trying to patch the details together in such a way as to benefit the most and damage the least will be given.

The Canadian Importers Association, a group of businessmen, has written to its members that it is not necessary for the Canadian negotiating team to have the information.

Production On Limited Scale Boosts Manufacturing Costs

MONTEAL (CP)—High production costs caused by limited-scale production are a major hindrance to Canadian manufacturers seeking export markets, Elizabeth Leitch, assistant economic adviser to the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce, said here.

She told the Montreal Business and Professional Women's Club that in only comparatively few instances can Canadian manufacturers achieve a sales volume that permits them to compete effectively with large-scale foreign producers.

A text of her speech was released to the press in advance of delivery.

"Canadian manufacturers are constantly setting up machinery and taking it down, which is extremely time-consuming and expensive," said Miss Leitch who has served as an adviser to the government since 1952.

"Now it needs only to get through Parliament."

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market advanced against some heavy profit taking last week and pushed the averages to their highest levels in history. Trading simmered down to 26,900 shares from 29,600 the previous week when the index reached its highest since June 1963.

Although some of the recent high flyers were knocked down considerably, this did not lead to general selling, as some prophets thought it might.

The anti-inflationary aspects of President Johnson's economic message to Congress demands the publication of a fairly sharp decline on Monday. After some further weakness early on Tuesday, blue chips led a recovery drive which put the averages well a head, even though more stocks fell than rose in the entire list.

The Dow Jones industrial average last week rose 7.35 to 783.6, its all-time closing peak. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks rose 1.6 to 291.6, its record closing high. Such issues as American Telephone and Telegraph (New Jersey), Radio Corp., Sears and Roebuck, New York Central and Pennsylvania Railroad posted new highs for 1963-64. In the case of A.T. & T. they topped their previous record of 1962.

The decision of IBM to propose a 50-per cent stock split has been disappointing to investors who had hoped for something along the order of 200-per cent to 500-per cent stock retraction down a gross ton last week.

Steel's price composite on the prime grade of scrap used in steelmaking, rose 24 cents to \$29.67 a gross ton last week.
