The Town Planning Act Regulations have been amended to include all that area within 540 feet of the centre line of the Highway between the EASTERN BOUNDARY OF THE VILLAGE OF ST. ELEANORS TO REIDS CORNER and from Wilnot Bridge to the NORTHERN BOUNDARY OF TRANS CANADA HIGHWAY at Albany Corner.

Regulations are now effective controlling:

- (1) Subdivision of land
- (2) Location of building on lot
- (3) Changing location of any building

Persons intending to construct or relocate a building in this area are reminded it is necessary to first obtain a permit from this Department. Persons selling building lots must first have a plan of subdivision approved by the Minister.
