Pioneer Building Purchased For New Dairy Co-operative

As anticipated in a recent Guardian news story, the Pioneer building on Water Street East, Summerside, has been purchased by a group on behalf of seven dairies who are planning to amalgamate and operate a central plant, it was learned last evening.

A meeting was held on Wednesday of the directors of all the companies to discuss the amalgamation proposals and approval was given to a prospectus which will be presented for the approval of the shareholders of the respective companies at a special general meeting which will be held before July 20th.

The companies involved are the Kensington Dairying Co-operative Association, Dunk River Dairy Co., Tryon Dairy Co., Kinkora Cheese Factory, Mont Carmel Dairy Co-operative Association, Tyne Valley cheese factory, and Grand River cheese factory.

If the plans are approved a company will be set up under the P. E. I. Co-operative Association Act which will involve a capitalization in the vicinity of one half million dollars.

The pioneer building is seventy feet long by fifty feet in width and a two-storey brick addition will be built which will be approximately 90 x 85 feet. It is hoped that this construction can be commenced this summer.

The property is sufficiently large to permit this expansion and in addition there is a small lot adjacent to the railway siding at the top of Noonan Street which will be of considerable value for shipping purposes.

It has been learned that an application will be made to the Dominion Government for assistance under an act which provides that grants can be given for amounts up to fifty per cent of the costs involved in the amalgamation of
