**DR. J. F. McNEILL**

Born at Long Creek, P. E. I., May 11, 1870; received early education in the Common School and Prince of Wales College. Associated in Drug business for ten years, owning own store previous to studying Medicine. Graduated from McGill University in 1902 and began practicing Medicine in Summerside immediately after graduation. Has been associated with the Prince County Hospital since its inception; member and past-president of the P. E. I. Medical Association and member of the Canadian Medical Association. Politics, Liberal; elected to the Legislature in 1922, 1927, 1930; a Minister Without Portfolio in the Lea Government.



**D. F. ARCHIBALD, C. A.**

Graduate Dalhousie University in Commerce with Great Distinction in 1934, moved to Charlottetown in 1936 and became Chartered Accountant in 1937; only practicing member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants resident in Prince Edward Island; secretary Institute of Chartered Accountants of P. E. I.



**H. K. S. HEMMING**

Born of British parents in Montreal. Educated at Quebec High School and McGill University in banking and manufacturing in Quebec, Montreal and Toronto until 1911. Took up business in London, England, until 1914. Graduated as Certified Public Accountant, practicing auditor in Montreal and Charlottetown. Is also engaged in Real Estate business at 83 Great George Street, Charlottetown. Keenly interested in research work on soil conditions especially the opening of the Charlottetown harbour to ocean vessels, the rehabilitation of abandoned farms and the extension on modern lines of canning factories for fruits, vegetables and fish.

Physician and Surgeon, Summerside; Lieutenant-Colonel, R. C. A. M. C.; educated at St. Dunstan's College and McGill University; member of attending staff, Prince County Hospital; membership in Canadian and Provincial Medical Associations; member, Medical Council of Canada and P. E. I. Medical Council; member, Provincial Sanatorium Commission, President, Children's Aid Society; membership in the K. of C., C. M. B. A., Caledonia Club, United Service Institute of Nova Scotia, Army & Navy Club and the Canadian Legion.



**REV. FATHER MURPHY, D. D.**

Was born at Hope River, P. E. I. He attended the local school and graduated from St. Dunstan's University with B. A. degree in 1910. He was a member of the Faculty of Prince of Wales College from 1910 to 1916, and was ordained to the Priesthood in St. Dunstan's Basilica, December 21, 1919, by the late Archbishop Henry J. O'Leary. Following his ordination Father Murphy was appointed to the staff of St. Dunstan's University, becoming Rector in 1926. He is a member of the Board of Education, the Knights of Columbus and is chairman of the Adult Education League.



**E. STIRLING BLANCHARD**

Was born at Charlottetown. Educated at West Kent School and Prince of Wales College and graduated from McGill University with the degree, Bachelor of Architecture, in 1910. Practised Architecture in Montreal until the outbreak of the war in 1914 when he enlisted with the 105th Bn. While serving with the 26th Bn. at Arras Mr. Blanchard was wounded and returned to Prince Edward Island in 1919 to continue his profession in Charlottetown.
