Targeted Undergraduate Student Research Award

Who Can Apply?

Female Canadian citizens and permanent residents who, at the time of application are registered as full-time students in an eligible undergraduate program in the physical sciences or engineering. Students in the life sciences (biology, psychology, etc.) are not eligible. When the award is held, the student must not have more than six, and no fewer than five, academic terms remaining to complete the bachelor's degree. Students should preferably have obtained a first-class (80% or above) average in their course work up to the time of application. Students must be exposed to research and development activities during the work period, and be supervised by a faculty member who holds an NSERC Research Grant at the time the application is submitted. A list of eligible supervisors is available from your department chair. Applications and further information are available from the Secretary to the Dean of Science, Duffy 211.

Deadline: February 10, 1995. All applications are to be submitted to the Office of the Dean of Science, Duffy 211.

Salary: Minimum Salary is \$1,125/month.

Student Union Awards

Memorial Bursary Fund for Students with Disabilities

To be eligible for this bursary, a student must:

- 1) Be in financial need
- 2) Be registered as a full-time student at UPEI
- 3) Submit a letter describing the disability
- 4) Have a letter of recommendation written in light of your disability
- 5) Pick up application form at Registrar's Office Applications and documents to be submitted to the Registrar's Office by February 10, 1995.

Residence Bursary

Bernadine Hall (\$500)

Following are the terms of reference for the above-named bursary:

1. Recipient must be a Third or Fourth-Year student living in Bernadine Hall who has lived there for at least two years.
2. Must have an average of 65% or better in last semester's work and passing grades in all five subjects.
3. Must write a personal essay about what she/he has participated in during her/his years in residence. How has she/he helped to promote spirit in Bernadine Hall?
4. Selection to be made by a committee from the Department of Student Services (composed of the Residence Manager or Co-ordinator of Residence Program, Director of Student Services, and one counsellor) with final approval given by the Scholarship and Bursary Committee.
5. Selection to be made in conjunction with other bursaries awarded from the Memorial Bursary Fund.

Application forms are available at the Registrar's Office or at Student Services. Closing date for applications is Friday, February 10, 1995.

Part-Time Student Bursaries

(2 of \$150 each)

The terms of these bursaries are as follows:

1. The applicant must be able to demonstrate financial need,
 2. Must be registered for either 3 or 6 semester hours of credit in the second semester,
 3. Must have received passing grades in all courses in the last semester registered at UPEI,
 4. Must be working towards a first degree as opposed to upgrading for a second degree.

Undergraduate Student Research Awards

Who Can Apply?

Canadian citizens and permanent residents who, at the time of application are registered as full-time students in an eligible undergraduate program in the natural sciences, engineering, or veterinary medicine. When the award is held, the B.Sc. and B.A. students must not have more than four academic terms remaining to complete the bachelor's degree. Students must not have started a program of graduate study. Students must have obtained a cumulative average of at least second-class (70%) over the previous years of study. Students must be exposed to research and development activities during the work period, and be supervised by a faculty member who holds an NSERC Research Grant at the time the application is submitted. A list of eligible supervisors is available from your department chair.

Applications and further information are available from the Secretary to the Dean of Science, Duffy 211.

Deadline: February 10, 1995. All applications are to be submitted to the Office of the Dean of Science, Duffy 211.

Salary: Minimum Salary is \$1,125/month.
