### Renovating Faded Garments.

A woman of resources has discovered a new and practically sure way of renovating and restoring to their former appearance spotted, soiled or faded cloth or serge gowns.

Pick about 20 ivy leaves, young, green ones by choice, wash them carefully and place them in a jug or basin. Add about a pint of boiling water, cover up the basin or jug and leave to soak for two or three hours, when it will be ready for use. Meanwhile the garment must be thoroughly brushed inside and out and all untidy braid or lining removed from the bottom. When ready, spread it on the table and carefully sponge with the ivy water. It must then be hung out to dry, when it will be found to have recovered its former color and to look quite like new.

Black silk may be cleaned in the same manner, but it needs more care. If the silk is in breadths, it must be lightly sponged and then tightly rolled over a cloth wound round a roller and left to dry. Black lace may also be renovated when soiled or brown with age by sponging with ivy water and then rolling over a cloth wound round a roller. It should not be ironed.

### To Prepare Oatmeal For the Table.

Where hard coal is used for cooking purposes oatmeal may be put over the fire at 6 o'clock in the evening, brought to boiling point and kept at this temperature overnight so that it may be ready to serve in the morning. Where soft coal, wood or gas is used for cooking purposes it will be necessary to put the oatmeal over the fire at noon when the luncheon or dinner is being prepared. Put 4 heaping tablespoonfuls of the steel cut oats into a quart of cold water. Add half a teaspoonful of salt and put it over the fire in a double boiler. Cover and cook continuously for one or two hours. Then it may be put aside until the night meal is being prepared and cooked again as long as the fire is burning, and then put aside to be reheated at breakfast time. The kettle should be covered closely, and the oatmeal must not be stirred from the beginning to the end of the cooking; otherwise the grains will be broken. Stirring oatmeal seems to destroy its flavor.—Mrs. S. T. Rorer in Ladies' Home Journal.

### The Dry Air Bath.

The dry air "bath" is highly recommended by those who have tried it and found it beneficial. One devoted dry air bather says she has found it far better than the morning cold sponge bath she took regularly for years.

"Rub the body," she says, "while it is unclotted with a quilted hairbrush. This excites the circulation and sends a glow all over the body. Let the morning sunlight fall on the body and do not be afraid of the air. After rubbing briskly you will be surprised to find how much dry dust and tiny bits of thin, white skin will be removed. Dress warmly after the exposure of the body and eat a good meal."—New York Tribune.

### Household Cares.

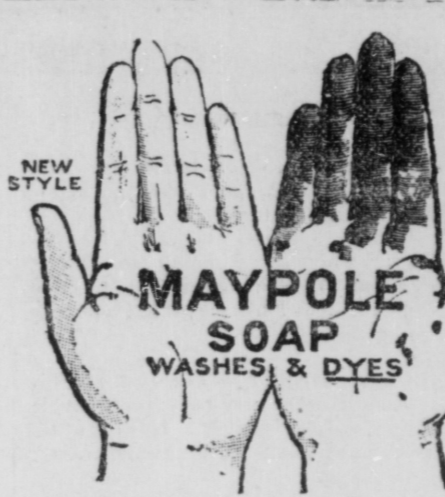
