The Swedish Cure For Drunkenness.

The habitual drunkard in Norway and Sweden renders himself liable to imprisonment for his love of strong drink, and during his incarceration he is required to submit to a plan of treatment for the cure of his failing, which is said to produce marvellous results. The plan consists in making the delinquent subsist entirely on bread and wine. The bread is steeped in a bowl of wine for an hour or more before the meal is served. The first day the habitual toper takes his food in this way without repugnance; the second day he finds it less agreeable to his palate; finally he positively loathes the sight of it. Experience shows that a period of from eight to ten days of this regimen is generally more than sufficient to make a man evince the greatest aversion to anything in the shape of wine. Many men after their incarceration become total abstainers.

News Notes

The umbrella continues the raining favorite. A nobleman is feeding daily 1,000 victims of the famine in Tokio, Japan.

The placing of the last stone in the spire of the cathedral at Ulm raises it to a height of 530 feet, and makes it the highest cathedral spire in the world.

The London Chronicle is severe on Lord Salisbury's cession of Heligoland in the African settlement, while The Frankfurter Zeitung says Heligoland is insignificant compared with Germany's African surrender. From all appearances Britain has its material advantage in the exchange while the sentimental profit remains with Germany.

Increased military expenditure is the order of the day even in Switzerland. Not long ago that little republic possessed only one fortification—that defining the St. Luzensteig, a road into Austria, on the extreme east of the Grisons. Now, however, a fort of the most modern construction at Airolo—overlooking the southern entrance of the St. Gothard tunnel—is completed and has received its guns, while similar forts are to be constructed at Andermatt and on the Oberalp and Furca roads. When a country which is strongly fortified by nature, and whose freedom is virtually guaranteed by the great powers, thinks such defenses necessary, where is militarism going to stop?

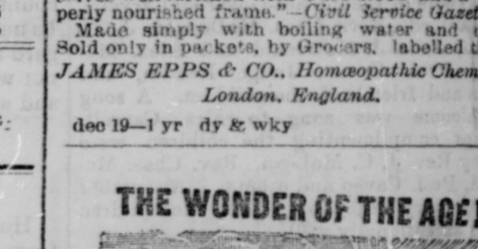
