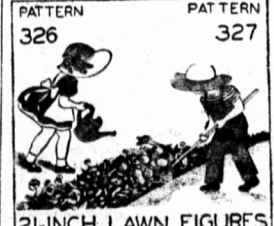
RESORT MODEL

This is not difficult if you follow a few simple rules in the selection of materials and in their use, as given on the pattern. The figure is traced directly to the wood and then the outlines where the colors join are traced. Perfect results are assured. 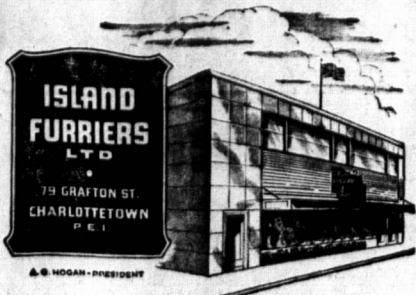

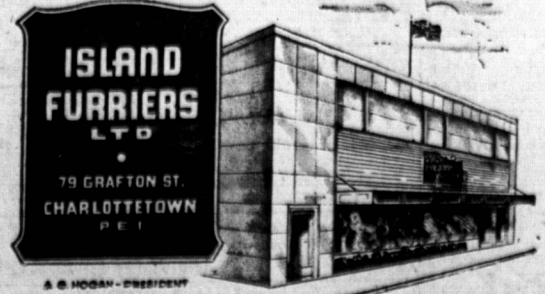
