Toronto Exchange is Quiet As Buying Fever Subsides

TORONTO (CP)—The trading floor of the Toronto Stock Exchange is relatively quiet these days as speculative fever has subsided at least for the moment.

But brokers say that the "reactionaries" alert is not much a part of Canadian stock markets for speculative issues to be quiet for a while.

Rails Rally Highlights N.Y. Mart

N.Y. (AP)—A rally of rails and some further excitement over companies with new discoveries of mineral wealth highlighted an irregular stock market last week.

Rail shares advanced vigorously on Wednesday in response to news that Pennsylvania Railroad and New York Central had signed an agreement with 17 rail unions on job protection measures, eliminating a major hurdle to the proposed merger of the two big carriers.

Many other railways are involved in merger possibilities as the Central Pennsylvania regional session in the industry is held in general. It served as a tonic to rail shares, bringing about new interest in the Dow Jones and Associated Press averages of rails traded on the New York Stock Exchange.

The rail rally spread some cheer to the rest of the stock market and gave the market its only advance of the week. Stocks were down sharply on Monday and Tuesday as a result of irregular Thursday and Friday.

NEW MINERAL FINDS
Fireworks were provided by two new mineral discoveries. U.S. Smelting disclosed that it had found a major copper ore lode in New Mexico. Occidental Petroleum reported indications of a gold deposit on its leased land in Montana.

U.S. Smelting bounded ahead 10 points in early trading Thursday, clipping the gain to 89. Its week-end and the stock market was trimmed to 25, a 12 1/2.

Occidental Petroleum was a heavily traded and held a net gain of four points at 31 1/2. Meanwhile, Texas Gulf Sun prior, the favourite in the current vogue for stocks with natural gas, rose 1/2 to 57 1/2.

The Dow Jones industrial average declined 5.36 to 807.67. The Dow Jones rails, however, led a hasty advance of 5.71 to 207.29.

1,523 ISSUES TRADED
The Dow Jones index also traded 728, declined and advanced. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks took a small loss of 4 at 306 1/2.

Volume for the week totalled 23,810,207 shares compared with 25,365,060 the previous week. The most active issues on the New York Stock Exchange were:

Westsy-Ferguson, up 2 1/2 at 26 1/2 on 275,000 shares and Synex up 4 1/2 at 82.

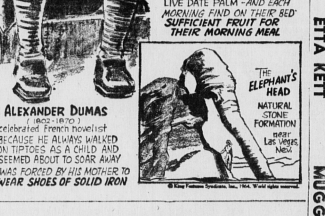
