## LOCAL AND OTHER ITEMS

**CRESCENTS.**—Weekly run tonight at 7 o'clock sharp. A full attendance requested.

**THE WEATHER.**—Fresh westerly winds fair, stationary or a little higher temperature.

**THE LAST** of the free entertainments tomorrow night in St. George's Lodge. All brother Orangemen cordially invited.

**THE DREDGE** is to operate in Summerside harbor after she is through with her work at the railway wharf here.

**GOOD TIME COMING.**—Miss Lantry's concert will be given in St. Patrick's Hall on the evening of the 31st inst. Help along a good cause by attending.

**WELL DONE.**—Last year the Church of England contributed the sum of \$3,000, 000 to foreign missions. The contribution of St. Paul's church, of this city, was \$1,100.00.

**DIPHTHERIA IN MONCTON.**—The Moncton schools reopened on Monday after being closed two weeks on account of the diphtheria scare. The disease, however, is not abating as rapidly as desirable, several new cases having broken out on Saturday.

**SCOTT ACT.**—Before Stipendiary Magistrate Blanchard at Georgetown on Monday evening, J. G. Scrimgeour, of Cardigan, was convicted of violating the Canada Temperance Act and fined \$50 and costs. A second summons against Mr. Scrimgeour was dismissed.

**A SEVERE LOSS.**—Linderman's theatre at Alameda, Cal., was destroyed by fire recently. Zera Sermon's show was occupying the theatre at the time, and the whole outfit, including the marionettes, was destroyed. Zera's loss is about \$3000. He had no insurance.

**FOR RICHIBUCTO.**—The schooner Jessie Newell left here yesterday for Richibucto, N. B., with a cargo of hay, and Messrs. Mackinnon & Muttart's merry-go-round, which will work this season in Northern New Brunswick, beginning at Richibucto, and perhaps in a part of Quebec.—Summerside Journal.

**FOOTBALL.**—The Abegweit football team will play a match with a Pictou team at Pictou on the Queen's Birthday. The Pictou team has been putting in some good practice in anticipation of the match and they will likely make it very interesting for the visitors. The game will be well worth witnessing.

**A BIG CARGO.**—The steamship Arcadia, of the Hamburg-American Packet Company, took out of this port, on her recent trip, the largest cargo of grain that has ever left this port in one vessel's hold. It consisted of 96,000 bushels of oats, 88,000 of buckwheat, 74,000 of corn, 3,000 of peas, and 3,900 bushels of wheat, making a total of 270,000 bushels. Besides this she had on board 500 tons of general cargo. With the exception of the corn the entire cargo was Canadian product.—Montreal Star.

**TOURIST TRAVEL.**—The Boston correspondent of the St. John Sun writes: The outlook for tourist travel to the lower provinces during the coming summer is very bright, and undoubtedly a larger number of people will visit New Brunswick than ever before. Quite a number of sportsmen have gone east during the present month, and every day their number is being added to. It is practically as cheap nowadays to go to the provinces as it is to go to Eastern Maine and New Hampshire resorts.
