Keen Interest In Poulton, Edwards Fight Indicates Record Breaking Crowd

A sleek, trim Harry Poulton, in the best condition of his boxing career, returns home from his training camp at Halifax today to await his ten round bout with Gil Edwards of New York here Monday night in a fight that has fired the imagination of boxing fans from one end of the Province to the other.

According to present indications a record breaking crowd will file their way into the Charlottetown Forum to watch Poulton match his unquestioned boxing skill against the power and punching ability of the terrific New York Colored slugger.

Advance ticket sales have been much higher than expectations and the daily inquiries pouring into the office of the ticket sellers from outside points lend evidence to the fact that this will be one of the most popular fight cards ever staged here.

The largest crowd that ever watched a fight in Charlottetown sat on the Len Wadsworth-Ace McCloskey fight back in 1945. The crowd that night numbered 4,500.

Edwards has been training with Orlando Zulueta, fifth ranking lightweight in the world. Zulueta is a fast, clever boxer whose style is not unlike Poulton's. After Edwards works out with Zulueta he boxes several rounds with Jimmie Flood a busy, rough slugger.

From his training gym comes the word that Poulton is in the best shape of his career. Harry is working out with two of Canada's top lightweights in Ace and Cobey McCloskey, two rough sluggers who fight the same style as Edwards.
