

French-Canadian Engineers Thinking In Global Terms

MONTREAL (CP) — French-Canadian engineers are starting to think in global terms, says a spokesman for the firm of Asselin, Benoit, Boucher, Ducharme et Lapointe.

The firm's two-year-old international division, Tecsub International Limited, now has two large contracts in Pakistan and is seeking a third in Cambodia. In the province of Quebec, the firm's contracts range from designing the powerhouse for the giant Manic 5 hydro-electric project on the Manicouagan River to working with French and Belgian engineers on a feasibility study for a proposed Quebec steel complex.

"If we thought conservatively," Mr. Ducharme said, "we would think in terms of Quebec only and use our capital here."

'BIG POSSIBILITIES'
"But there are big possibilities abroad, especially if we go to the French African and Asian countries. Canada has a good name in these countries, never having been a colonial power, and we speak their language."

Mr. Ducharme also thinks it "good business not to have all your eggs in one fire." If things slow up in Quebec, "a big engineer's organization like ours must have other outlets."

A 125-man firm strongly believes in "calculated risks."

"We look a calculated risk to get the Pakistan contracts," Mr. Ducharme said. "It took us a year of promotional work and some \$50,000."

"We knocked on the doors of a lot of government offices in Pakistan and we now feel we're getting to know and have confidence in us. The future looks bright."

The Pakistan contract involves building a water supply and filtration system for the new capital of Islamabad and the other constructing port facilities.

Motor Vehicle Shipments Up

OTTAWA (CP) — Shipments of Canadian-made motor vehicles rose sharply by 29.1 per cent in September to 38,553 units from 27,582 in the same month last year, the bureau of statistics has reported.

With only August showing a decrease compared with a year previous, shipments in the January-September period advanced 21.3 per cent to 432,753 units from 356,809. Shipments of vehicles imported from the United States were up in the

month to 629 units from 584 last year in the cumulative period at 4,103, compared with 5,218.
