**Capt. A.J. McCabe Wins Permanent Possession Of MacKinnon Rifle Cup**

Captain A. J. McCabe won permanent possession of the MacKinnon Cup Saturday afternoon as he scored a total of 96 points on the Squaw Point Rifle Range. The handsome cup was donated by Lt. Col. D. A. MacKinnon, D.S.O. The shoot-off between the four qualified marksmen for the cup was held under trying conditions. There was a strong gusty wind blowing from the right with intermittent showers falling and the marksmen had to use from eleven to nineteen minutes of wind at the 600 yard range. The four men qualified by winning the Grand Aggregate here once a year over the past five years. Sgt. G. G. MacLennan won the Grand Aggregate twice. start since last June, pitched the Yankees to a nine-hit victory. The world champions ended with 98-56 record.

Allie Clark blasted a home run, triple and double to lead the A's to their nightcap victory. The Senators pounded Bobby Shantz for 13 hits in the first game.

Ned Garver, the Browns' ace, had more support than he needed as he set down Chicago. He became the first 20-game winner for St. Louis Browns since 1908.

Virgil Trucks held the Tribe to five hits in hanging up his 13th victory of the season and sixth in a row. He also batted in both Bengal runs with a bases-loaded single in the seventh.

Gerry Staley blanked the Cubs with four singles to enable St. Louis Cardinals to win their nightcap game. It was halted after six innings because of darkness. The Cubs rallied for six runs in the last two innings to win the first game. Bob Rush, fourth Cub hurler, was credited with the victory, his 11th against 12 losses.

Ralph Kiner hit a grand-slam home run to break a 4-4 tie and give Pittsburgh their victory. It was Kiner's 42nd homer.

The mighty game-winning clout came in the 11th inning after the Reds had tied the contest in the eighth.

The Giants whipped Boston Braves 3-0 Saturday behind the superb pitching of Sal Maglie to take undisputed command for the first time this season.

But the Dodgers turned on Philadelphia Phillies and won 5-0 Saturday night behind big Don Newcombe to tie the teams again.

Newcombe came through with his 20th pitching victory as the Dodgers turned in sensational fielding plays with Jackie Robinson and Billy Cox the stars.

Maglie was the big man in the Giants' triumph over the Braves, holding the Beantowners to five hits. Warren Spahn, on the mound for the Braves, hurled creditably for the eight innings he worked, allowing only two runs and five hits.

nothing games from Boston Red Sox 4-0 and 3-1.

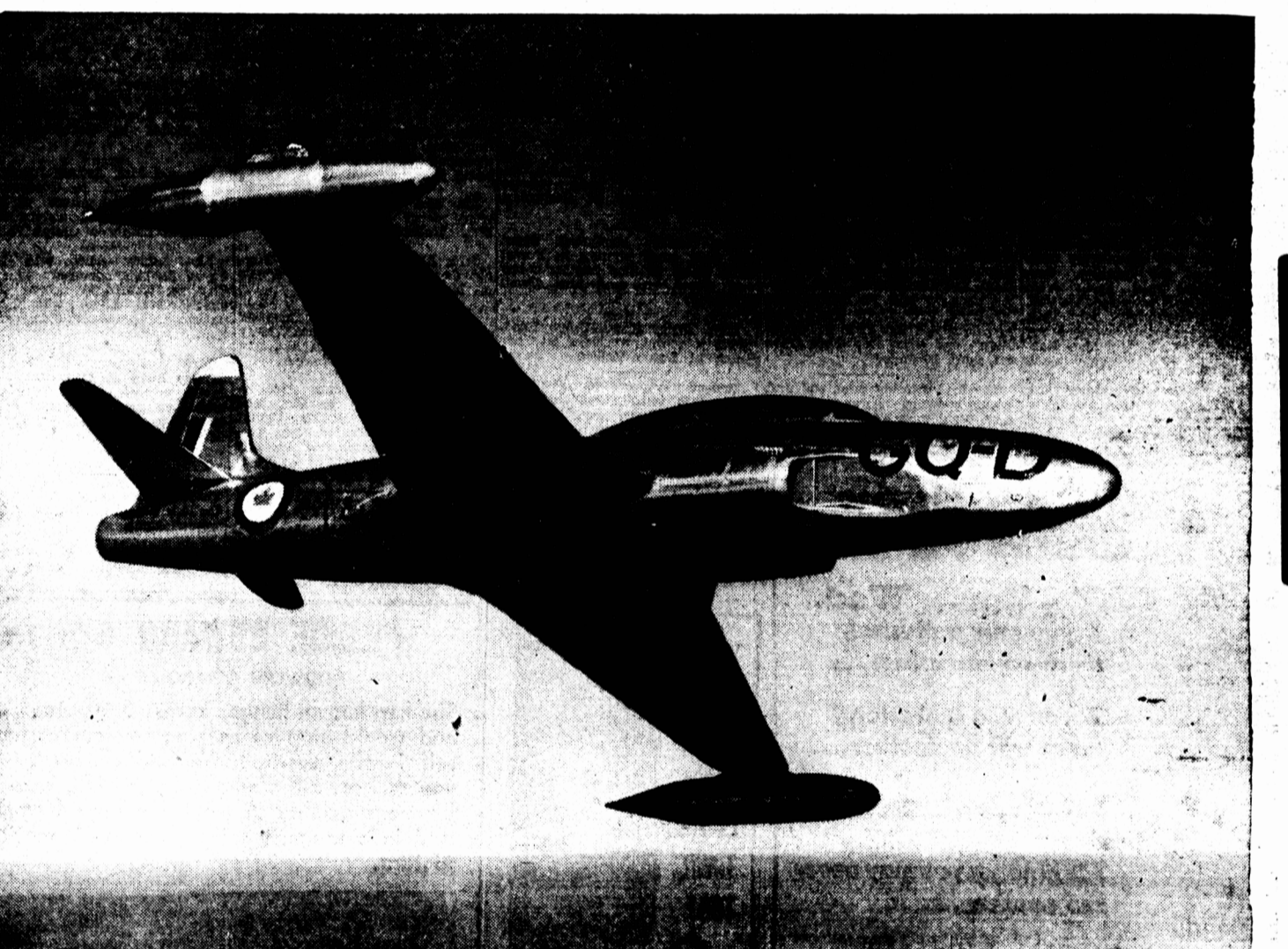
Ed Lopat and Bob Kuzava shared the duties in the first game, Lopat going the first six chapters and Kuzava hurling the last three.
