A lot of grain is still unattended to in this community. Farmers have left their grain in the fields and gone to work at their more profitable crop of potatoes.

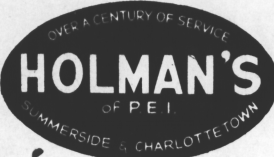
