

Roman Catholic Theologians Consider Church Doctrines

VATICAN CITY (AP)—Leading theologians of the Roman Catholic Church from all over the world, ending a week-long congress, said the Bible and man must be given greater importance in religious study and worship.

The 1,200 theologians came here to consider how to interpret new doctrines laid down for the Church by the ecumenical council of 1962-1965.

Pope Paul, receiving them in

audience, praised freedom of debate on matters of theology but told the experts any new development must safeguard loyalty to the Church and to its hierarchy.

Rev. Edouard Dhans, a Belgian who is rector of Rome's Gregorian University, summed up the conclusions reached by the congress at a press conference.

He said the theologians limited themselves to discussing the most crucial points in the documents of the council relevant to theology.

He listed the following conclusions:

—The science of theology in the Roman Catholic Church must develop a new method for its scholars, based primarily on the Bible and on the "historic dimension" of mankind's rescue through Christ. The role of official teaching of the hierarchy and the great theologians of the past, such as St. Thomas Aquinas, will

accordingly be reduced in the new theological method.

—The council has provided a way toward overcoming differences with other Christian religions about Mary. Mary draws her salvation from Christ, as all men. She is first in the Church, but within the Church. She is mother of the Church, but also member of the Church. Father Dhans said in this way it is possible to "meet and take steps forward together with the separated brethren."

—Christ is mysteriously present not only in the Eucharist, but also in a group of persons if the group is made up of Roman Catholics and other Christians. Husband, wife and children belonging to different Christian religions do well to join in family prayer. Public reading of the Bible must be extended. The mixed marriage issue as such was not dealt with at this congress.

—The inspiring action of the Holy Spirit is at work in the whole Church and not only in the Church hierarchy, although the people of God must respect the teachings of the hierarchy.

CONTRACT BRIDGE

South dealer. Both sides vulnerable.

WEST: ♠ A J 10 9 8, ♥ Q 8 6, ♦ 7 5, ♣ K J 4

EAST: ♠ K Q 5 5 2, ♥ J 7 6 4 3 2, ♦ 9, ♣ A Q J 10

South West North East
1 ♠ 1 ♠ 2 ♠ 3 ♠
3 ♠ Pass 3 ♠ 3 ♠

The bidding:
South West North East
1 ♠ 1 ♠ 2 ♠ 3 ♠
3 ♠ Pass 3 ♠ 3 ♠

Opening lead—ace of spades. A careful declarer tries desperately to avoid putting all his eggs in one basket. He refuses to settle for a method of play that depends entirely on luck, when another method of play is available by which the luck factor is either reduced or eliminated.

Here is a typical case. Let's say you're declarer at five diamonds and West leads the ace and another spade, which you ruff. Offhand it looks as though the outcome depends on whether the clubs are divided 2-2. If they are, you lose one club

Service In Canadian Army Bars Former Home To Yank

BRUSSELS, Belgium (AP)—Robert Charles Mote said here U.S. officials are barring his return to his home in Kokomo, Ind., because he once served two months in the Canadian Army.

He has a wife, a native of Luxembourg, and a 17-month-old son, born in the United States.

Mote, born Sept. 4, 1934, in

Kokomo, said in an interview the U.S. consul in Winnipeg, U.S., handed him a certificate of loss of American citizenship last April because he joined the Canadian Army for two months in 1953.

"Twenty-one turncoats (U.S. army defectors) returned from (North) Korea and were allowed to live again in the United States. They were traitors. I am not and never was. As a youngster, I joined the Canadian Army for two months in 1953, and since 1956, the immigration office has been trying to get me deported from the U.S. where I have lived until the beginning of this year.

"I want to go back to the United States, where I can earn my living, and live close to my relatives, my father, sister and brother, in Kokomo, Ind., or my brother William Mote, who lives in Grand Canyon, Ariz. I cannot do it, but my son, born in the States and who has an American passport, can. My wife, a Luxembourg holder of an alien registration card in the States, could also."

RC Priest Retirement Effective

VATICAN CITY (Reuters)—Pope Paul's recommendation to the Roman Catholic clergy to retire at the age of 75 came into effect Tuesday, clearing the way for younger men to fill high church posts.

The recommendation, made at the suggestion of the recent Vatican Ecumenical Council, affects all clergy who now are expected to offer their resignation from pastoral duties if they are 75 or older.

The recommendation, made in a letter Aug. 12, resulted from a majority feeling at the council that active pastoral work should not be left in the hands

of priests who could be senior or infirm.

Vatican sources said the Pope has already asked at least three cardinals to carry on their work despite their age—Francis Cardinal Spellman, 77, archbishop of New York; Ernesto Cardinal Ruffini, 78, archbishop of Palermo, and Giacomo Cardinal Lercaro, 75, archbishop of Bologna.

The first prelate whose resignation from pastoral work was accepted was Angel Cardinal Herrera y Oria of Malaga, who is 80. He resigned last month.

RCY Review NATO Future

BONN (AP)—Representatives of the United States, Britain and West Germany will meet here at the end of this month to review the future of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, a spokesman for the West German foreign ministry announced Tuesday. It is expected that they will make a report by the end of this year.
