NEW YORK, May 29—Senate Finance Committee party due to the insistence of Vice President Garner, have apparently agreed on a tax bill to be submitted to the Senate, but the bill is not in line with administration wishes. However, it paved the way for a swift enactment of the bill and consequently, it is possible that Congress will adjourn next week. The House yesterday passed the Anti-Chain Store Bill after striking out provisions designed to eliminate the basing point system and to institute a requirement for classification of customers. Bill has now been returned to the Senate and if the bill is passed by the Senate and the House it will be worked out in conference. Broker's loans last week decreased \$22,000,000 and for the fourth week in succession the report was lower. Small volume on the reaction yesterday was rather encouraging and although they made for irregularity the market will do better.

TORONTO, May 29—Senior gold issues came to the front in today's mining section market and displayed the strongest note shown by the group in weeks. Dome and Lake Shore chalked up the record high prices of their history, both selling above the 60 mark. The gold share index advanced about 2-1-2 points to 137.86, the highest close for the group this year and the miscellaneous mines index slipped 25 to 129.40.

Dome sold up to 61 and closed at 60 for a net gain of 2 points and Lake Shore was a fraction over 60 for a broken lot and the close at 59 3-8, up 3-8 net. McIntyre firm 1 5-8 to 44 3-4 and over 1-2 to 15 7-8. Hollinger traded 10,000 shares and Dome and McIntyre 2,400 to 3,000 each. Wright Hargreaves changed hands in volume at a gain of 20 cents

and Teck Hughes firm 5. Pioneer was unchanged.
