**COURT OF CHANCERY.**  
Before the Master of the Rolls.  
FRIDAY, March 11.

Nicholson vs. Cameron.—This is an action arising out of certain dealings by the parties with James H. Good for the lending of money on a mortgage.

A bill was filed by the complainant to set aside a mortgage made by the plaintiff in favor of the defendant, wherein the consideration is stated to be \$800, and which was duly executed by the plaintiff. After the mortgage was executed, Good, the solicitor, applied to Cameron for the money, which was paid by him to Good. The plaintiff alleges that the mortgage was incorrectly read over to him, the only consideration read by Good was \$150.00, Good only paid the plaintiff \$150. The balance was appropriated by Good to his own use. The question for consideration of the Court is whether Good was the agent of the plaintiff or defendant and whether in any event the defendant did not pay over the money to Good at his own risk without having a written authority from plaintiff so to do. This case is the first of its kind tried in our courts and is a very important one. M. McLeod, Q. C., and D. C. McLeod, for plaintiff, F. L. Hazard, Q. C. and W. S. Stewart, Q. C., for defendant.
