THE NEW CABINET.

Sir John Thompson's Policy To be Faithfully Adhered to.

MONTREAL, Dec. 21. Premier Bowell and Hon. Messrs. Costigan, Tupper, Ives, Dickey and Montague arrived here this evening, and at 10.30 the Premier met Lord Aberdeen by appointment at the viceregal residence, Sir's residence. The 11 of those Hon. M. Kenzie Bowell has invited to sit at the country's council table was submitted to His Excellency, and those Hon. gentlemen named above will be sworn in tomorrow at 10.30 o'clock, the ministerial party leaving in the afternoon for the Capital. The only new minister who will need to go back to his constituents for re-election is Mr. Dickey. The election will take place at once. Hon. Mr. Montague and Senator Donald Ferguson will merely require to take the oath of a Privy Councillor.

The Premier being interviewed by your correspondent, said Sir John Thompson's policy would be faithfully adhered to.
