

TWA Stock May Be Sold

NEW YORK (AP)—Hughes Tool Co. proposed Friday to sell to the public its 75.18-per-cent interest in Trans World Airlines. The sale would involve 6,584,377 common shares valued at about \$500,000,000. Plans of Hughes Tool for the sale were disclosed in a registration statement TWA said was filed with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. The sale, which would be one of the largest secondary offerings in U.S. financial history, would be through a national underwriting syndicate headed

by Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner and Smith. The Hughes Tool stock in TWA has been held for several years by trustees appointed by creditors who financed purchases of aircraft. Hughes Tool Co. is wholly owned by Howard Hughes, the reclusive financier who has not been publicly in several years. SEC approval of the proposed stock offering would end a legal battle between Hughes and the TWA trustees and his creditors that began in 1961. TWA filed a \$135,000,000 trust suit against Hughes Tool. Hughes filed a \$366,000,000 counter claim. Despite court orders, Hughes refused to appear to defend or prosecute the suits and was represented by lawyers.
