BENEFIT OF NANNERY AND LINDLEY TO-NIGHT.

We feel pleasure in calling our readers' attention to the *bonne bouche* offered them this evening at Market Hall for above purpose. "Rosedale," the piece chosen, will receive its first presentation here. Originally produced at Wallack's Theatre, New York, it had an unprecedented run, and simultaneously was produced by E. A. Sothern, as a "Wild Goose," at the Haymarket, London. The drama is of the legitimate order, and its humor and pathos alternate, whilst the characters are strongly drawn, and ably developed. Mr. E. T. Stetson has been the exponent of the leading role in New York, and the press speaks highly of his efforts. There will be several special features introduced into the piece, including the Band of the 82nd Battalion (under direction of Mr. Galbraith) who have volunteered their services. Miss Marion Summers, the eminent New York soubrette, whose name is a synonyme for mirth, will make her first appearance this evening. The New York *Sun* thus speaks of this lady: "Miss Marion Summers, appeared as 'Rosa Leigh,' in 'Rosedale,' and at once scored a triumph. Her laugh is infectious, and her humor is so natural that it is not acting but spontaneous. In fact, her every appearance was hailed with laughter and applause." Little Nellie Stetson appears this evening for the first time also, as Little Arthur May. Lieut. Governor Haviland and family have kindly signified their intention of being present this evening, which is, in itself, a befitting recognition of the beneficiaries' efforts to amuse. The pieces produced by them have been so far characterized by talent and mirth; and we only wish they could be induced to reproduce "Hamlet," for it would fill the house.

Supreme Court.

July 17.

In the case of *Essoy vs. Connolly*, the Jury returned a verdict for the plaintiff for \$25.75 and costs. The action was brought to recover damages for false imprisonment. Mr. Geo. Essoy (who lives at Halifax) was here at the reception of the Marquis and the Princess. On the day of the review at the Park, he got into defendant's cab, was driven to the Park, held the cab while the review was going, returned to Rankin House in it, and paid the driver his charge, viz.: \$7.00. Before leaving the city Mr. Essoy was arrested, at the suit of Connolly, for \$20. He defeated defendant in the lower court and brought this action for false imprisonment. For the plaintiff, Palmer & McLeod. For the defendant, Hodgson & McLeod.

Since Saturday the Court has been engaged in the appeal case of *Meacham vs. Robertson*.

NEW DEPARTURE IN REAPERS

Independent Testimony.

(From the *Rural New Yorker*.)

"The representation of farming machinery at the fair is very complete, and an inspection of it gives a vivid impression of the sweep of improvement in this department. Most of the leading manufacturers have examples of their best work, but, with one exception, we cannot point to anything very novel that has not already been called to the attention of agriculturists. Our exception refers to the William Anson Wood Mower and Reaper Company, of Albany, N. Y., whose complete exhibit includes a very decided improvement in a light reaper that is a novelty, and demands special description. The leading feature, as before stated, is the new light reaper, which not only combines simplicity with strength, durability and light weight, but has, in addition, a completely new device. This is a brake shaped crank, a little to the right and in front of the driver's seat, where it can be easily operated, that works an eccentric which raises or lowers at the same time both sides of the cutter bar and table, and tilts the rakes forward so that they pick up the grain perfectly. A lever, just back of the crank, throws the table to any desired angle. With this improvement the driver can cut grain at the surface, or at any intermediate distance from the level of the ground up to a height of sixteen inches. While the weight of this reaper is only 750 pounds, it is yet so nicely balanced and thoroughly made that it works with great smoothness and precision, and with the least amount of friction. The drive-wheel has a wide tread and is without lags. As this machine is covered by 15 patents, it may be said that it starts its career under ample protection. The new inclosed-gear mower is marked by simplicity and thoroughness of construction, running very smoothly and not jumping when heavy work comes in its way. This good feature is mainly due to the manner in which the weight of the pitman protector and its connections is distributed. A minor point, but one not without influence, is the handsome and tasteful manner in which the new styles are painted. The colors are durable ones and of neutral tints, that cause the machines to present a neat appearance, even after long use."

FOR NEWFOUNDLAND.—The schooner *Celacanon*, Capt. English, sailed for St. John's, Nfld., on Friday evening, with a cargo valued at \$3,250, consisting of 600 bushels oats, 40 head cattle, 60 sheep, 6 horses, 1000 feet plank, 2 wagons, 100 bushels malt, 54 tubs butter, and 12 rolls leather. The schooner *Emma* also sailed for Newfoundland on Friday, with a cargo consisting of 600 bushels oats, 400 do potatoes, 26 head cattle, 6,000 bricks, 22 sheep, 2 suits furniture, 4 sewing machines, and 2 tubs butter, valued at \$1,158.

NEWS BY TELEGRAPH.

NEW YORK, July 16.

Gen. Hancock has not yet written a line of his letter of acceptance. It will probably not be ready under a fortnight.

Baldo, the Italian murderer, who will be hanged August 6th, was prostrated by the hanging of Cox to-day. He shut himself in a cell, could not eat, and refused to see any one.

This evening Dr. Tanner returned from a long ride. He felt cheery and seemed in good spirits.

BOSTON, Mass., July 16.

A heavy thunder storm in various parts of the country is reported this evening. At Hanover, N. H., a disastrous cyclone unroofed houses, blew down barns and did other damage. At Chester, Pennsylvania, thirty-five houses were unroofed.

PETERSBURG, Va., July 16.

There were heavy rains last night in the adjacent countries, extending to North Carolina, bringing great relief to the growing crops.

MANCHESTER, July 16.

The *Guardian's* London correspondent writes that out of the 169 votes, into which the estimates are divided, 92 remain to be taken in committee. The session prolonged until September, or abandonment of several of the Government bills, appears to be the choice of Parliament. It is admitted on all hands that the Irish Compensation bill cannot pass the Lords, and Gladstone is being strongly urged to abandon it. He shows no disposition to adopt that course, though the consequence of his persistence threaten to be more unfortunate than at present appears on the surface.

At a public meeting last night, Sir Wilfrid Lawson presiding, several members of Parliament, who were present, protested against the erection of a statue to the late Prince Imperial in Westminster Abbey. A letter was read from Victor Hugo, expressing a hope that the Commons would adopt a motion against the erection of the statue.

CONSTANTINOPLE, July 16.

The German Ambassador presented a collective note to the Porte on Thursday. Reports come from the Provinces of floods, involving loss of life, stock, and damage to crops.

Mr. Goschen continues to urge the Porte to satisfy the claim of Montenegro. The state of affairs here is regarded as critical, the new War Minister having pronounced strongly in favor of resistance to the Berlin conference.

NEW YORK, July 16.

The gas companies have decided that the electric light is not a success, and have raised the price from \$1 to \$2.25 per thousand feet. Gas stocks, in consequence, have advanced from 20 to 30 per cent.

Chastine Cox was hanged at 8.37 a. m. He walked with a firm step and composed demeanor to the gallows and died in sixteen minutes.

SANTA FE, July 16.

Forty-two cars were wrecked on the North Mexico and Southern Pacific Railroad. Thirteen cars were smashed and three persons injured but none fatally.
