Potatoes To Be First For Radiated Part

By CLAUDE HENAU (CP) — Gamma radiation not only makes potatoes safe for its use in the cobalt bomb treatment of cancer, will soon be used to help preserve food products. The process will at first be used only on potatoes—the only product to receive approval so far from the federal food and drug administration. An irradiating plant is being set up by Newfield Products Ltd., which intends to apply the process to other foods as they are approved by health authorities. A spokesman for Newfield said its plant will be the first of its type in the Western world. The idea for the company first came to Nelson Saunders, a young Montreal businessman, while he was visiting the commercial products laboratories of Atomic Energy Canada Ltd. during the summer of 1962. He gathered together a group of businessmen and plans for the plant eventually took shape. The plant will be constructed at Mont St. Hilaire, 20 miles east of Montreal, and is expected to be completed by July, 1965. A newfield spokesman said the process is used to develop an efficient method of preventing the sprouting of potatoes as Canada's storage crop. About 4,000,000,000 pounds of potatoes a year, still needs to import 200,000,000 pounds a year from the United States. The first irradiated potatoes will be sent to processors, such as potato chip makers, who cannot use potatoes which have been preserved by refrigeration. The company hopes to be able to provide potatoes in the chipper at about \$3 to \$4 for a 100-pound bag during May and June, the period when chippers now are required to import potatoes at \$7 or \$8 a bag. A company spokesman said Canada is not producing potatoes at full capacity because of the preservation problem. With the eight-month keeping properties of irradiated potatoes, production could be increased. A spokesman for the Atomic Energy Canada Ltd. said the plant will build the facility, said food treated in this way is wholesaled.
