Further Tenders Called For Geo'town Wharf Work

OTTAWA, (Special) — The Public Works Department has called tenders for the reconstruction of heating and plumbing at the railway wharf at Georgetown, P.E.I. John A. Macdonald (P.C. Kings) disclosed Friday. Tenders will close on Aug. 20 to enable work to be completed before early winter.

The project is part of a \$1,000,000 development being undertaken at the Georgetown wharf and railway.

"This contract," Mr. Macdonald explained, "is separate from the general contract now held and being rushed by Diamond Construction Co., for completion in time to accommodate farmers throughout the area this fall.

"The heating plant will be separate from the warehouse and a sub-contract has already been let for the fireproof building to contain it."

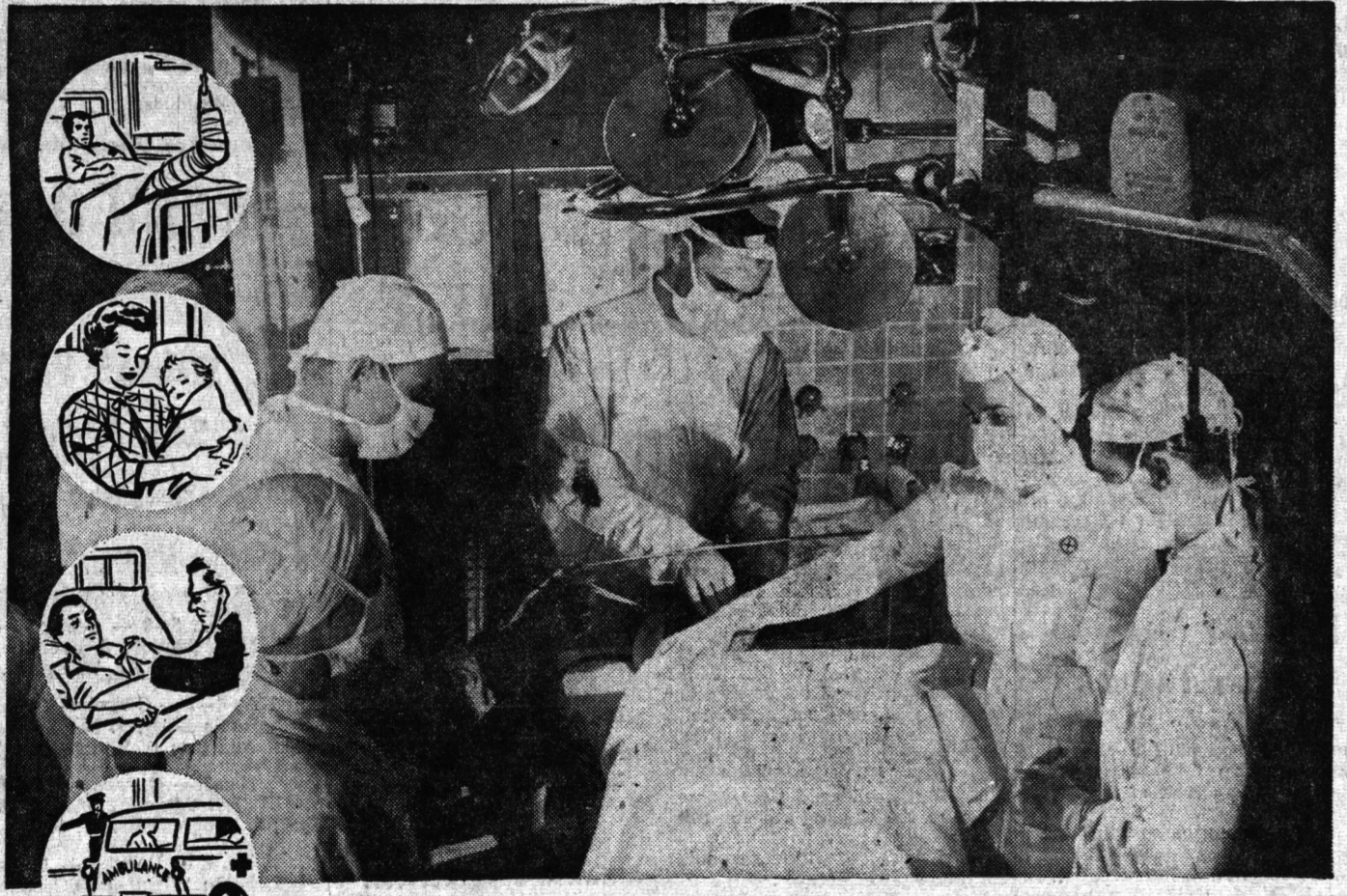
