


Men sure go for a MAGIC cake

COCONUT FUDGE CHIFFON CAKE

Mix and sift into a bowl, 1 c. plus 2 tbs. once-sifted cake flour, 1 1/2 tps. Magic Baking Powder, 1/2 tsp. salt, 1/2 c. fine granulated sugar; mix in 1/2 c. desiccated coconut. Make a well in the dry ingredients and add in the order given (do not stir mixture), 1/2 c. corn (salad) oil, 2 unbeaten egg yolks, 1/4 c. plus 2 tbs. water, 1 tsp. vanilla, 2 1/2 ounces unsweetened chocolate, melted and cooled. Stir the liquids into intermingling smooth. Measure into a large bowl 1/2 c. egg whites (at room temperature) and sprinkle with 1/4 tsp. cream of tartar; beat until the egg whites are very stiff—much stiffer than for meringues, angel cakes, etc. Add flour mixture, about a quarter at a time, and fold after each addition until batter and egg whites are thoroughly combined. Turn batter into an ungreased 8" angel cake pan; bake in a rather slow oven, 325°, about 1 hour. Immediately cake comes from oven, invert pan and suspend cake until cold.




