Blake Ascribes Success To Co-operation And Harmony

MONTRÉAL (CP)—Hector (Toe) Blake, 43-year-old rookie coach who piloted Montreal Canadiens to their first National Hockey League championship since 1947, ascribed his success Wednesday largely to co-operation of the players and harmony on the club.
 "I was fortunate, too, in getting good hockey out of the rookies," said Blake. "Remember we are using four of them regularly—Jean-Guy Talbot and Bob Turner on the defence and Pocket Rocket Richard and Claude Provost up forward."
 "But I'm particularly pleased with the fine co-operation the fellows have given me. How many players would have taken it when they were pushed out? Butch has been my big helper with the rookies."
 "Some veterans would have re-

sented being shoved out of their job by rookies and could have showed it. The result could have affected the whole club.
 "Jackie Leclair wasn't resentful, either, when we sent him down to the Royals of the Quebec Hockey League. He took the right attitude about it, worked hard got into top condition and came back."

STRESSED HARMONY

Blake said he has always stressed harmony although it is comparatively easy to maintain when a club is winning. When it hits the rough spots, that's different.
 "We ran into a bad streak in January, lost four of five games—three of them in a row. I told the boys not to get panicky or start blaming anyone for losing a game. I told them that was my job.
 "I don't call down a player in front of everybody in the dressing-room if he did something that cost us a game. I try to sleep on it first because I might say something I'd be sorry about the next day."
 Blake took over this season from the man he once played under—Dick Irvin, now coach of Chicago Black Hawks. Did Blake follow or divert from any particular methods of Irvin?
 "I went along with most of Irvin's disciplinary rules, but I wasn't quite so strict. Perhaps when your club is on top you're inclined to be less strict."
