The death of Edgar Wallace, prolific writer of mystery stories, gives rise to great deal of conjecture concerning the life, the career of this versatile author.

That Wallace came up the hard way is an accepted fact by those who knew him best as a youth he had few opportunities, but like many another great man he made the best of what he had, winning in the end the praise of thousands.

The British Museum Catalogue devotes twenty of its pages to name 21 titles and ramifications of subject which include mystery tales, novels of adventure, etc. covering the works of the great author.

Edgar Wallace became a prolific writer because his was a "labour of love" in view of the fact that he had spoken millions of words into a dictaphone when his secretary wife was not at hand to take down his stories in shorthand.

Of this author, many fantastic tales have sprung up. Of his friends who knew him best it is said that he loved life too well to save any money, though he had written himself a fortune he died deep in the red.

Drying a Wet Book

Do not dry a wet book by the fire, or it will warp. If water has been spilled on a cherished book, place some blotting paper on each side of the wet leaves and press with a moderately warm iron, treating each leaf separately. The leaves will neither warp nor wrinkle.

Lemons

Lemons may be kept nicely for a long time by placing them in a tight container and covering with cold water, which should be changed weekly.

Marshmallows

If it is necessary to cut marshmallows, dip the kitchen scissors into powdered sugar before each cutting and there will be no sticking.

Cook's Corner

PLUM PIE

Pie paste 2/3 cup sugar Dash of cloves (optional) 3 tablespoons flour Few grains salt 3 cups sliced plums (about 1 1/2 lbs.)

Line a 9 inch pie plate with pastry. Mix sugar, cloves, flour and salt. Sprinkle a small portion of mixture over unbaked pie shell. Combine sliced plums with remainder of mixture and fill shell. Arrange a lattice work of pie paste over top of pie. Bake in a hot oven, 400 degrees F., for 30 minutes. Yield: six servings.

NOTE: As an alternate to cloves, sprinkle 1/2 teaspoon almond flavoring over plums.
